Assistant Scoutmaster Howard Knox of Troop 72, Methodist church of Libertyville, has completed his requirements for Eagle rank and is to be formally awarded his Eagle badge at the district scouting exhibition coming at the end of March.

Eagle Scout Knox has worked his way up through scouting ranks and leadership position in Libertyville Troop 71 and 72 and in the Sea Scout Ship Eagle. His progress has been rapid and consistent.
