## LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS MEETS 17TH

### Session at Y.W.C.A. and Good Program Planned; Speakers are Prominent

On Feb. 17, the Highland Park League of Women Voters holds its regular monthly meeting at the Y. W. C. A.

Luncheon will be served at 12:30 and the committee is hoping for a large attendance at the first luncheon to be provided at the lowered cost. It will be an unusually interesting program with two speakers. Mrs. W. A. Roberts will discuss "What Patriotism Involves," a talk commemorating the Washington Bicentennial, and Mrs. Henry P. Chandler will tell of the work of the league in the field of Child Welfare.

Mrs. Roberts was past president of the Chicago Forum, and former vice-president of the Cook County League of Women Voters. She is now serving as chairman of the week-end School of Foreign Affairs.

#### Long Career

Mrs. Roberts has had a long career of service in public office, as former vice president of the Cook county league, president of the Chicago Forum, and of the Woodlawn league, and of the Seventh Ward auxiliary of the Illinois Equal Suffrage association. She is now serving as chairman of the week-end School of Foreign Affairs of the league, and is exceptionally qualified to discuss the broader meaning of patriotism.

Mrs. Chandler has spent six months in an intensive study of delinquent boys and girls under the care of the state. This study has brought her into close contact with children and the institutions caring for them and yielded much of human interest which has helped both local and state organizations in their attempt to handle the young delinquent. Mrs. Chandler was formerly connected with the Immigrants Protective League of Chicago and was a member of the research staff of the School of Social Service Administration of the University of Chicago.

### D.A.R. Better Films Committee Review

There are two good family pictures, varying decidedly in theme and treatment for your entertainment this week. Many have heard of "Delicious" and have been eagerly awaiting it. We have the two well-teamed favorites, Janet Gaynor and Charles Farrell, in a comedy in which a wealthy polo player falls in love with a little Scotch immigrant. El Brendel's amusing role helps the film tremendously. There is a clever dream sequence, and a good song and the cast is excellent.

"Rainbow Trail" is taken from Zane Grey's novel and features Geo. O'Brien in a new type of western hero. It is a welcome innovation to find a well-educated cowboy. A dying man gives the hero a map of a lost valley where an elderly couple

and their daughter have long been held prisoners by outlaws. After many thrilling adventures the hero rescues the family.

"Secret Witness" has an interesting and ingenious theme and is rather above the average as murder mystery stories go. It is not especially good for very small children, but older ones will be entertained.

"Nice Women" brings us Sidney Fox and Allan Mowbray in a pleasant little comedy, quite an interesting plot and the acting is most excellent.

"Guilty Generation" is a fair story with the old, oft repeated, gangster element. A racketeer, Leo Carillo, bringing the role of father as an Al Capone type, and causing great sorrow and fear in the hearts of his family. Not recommended for the very young.
