Things To Cook

The following recipe for icebox cookies will be popular with your family, as well as helpful in deciding what kind of cookies you want to use to fill your cookie jar.

They may be prepared a day or more before you want to bake them, formed into a roll of the size you want to cut your cookies, then placed in the refrigerator or other cold place until you are ready to bake them.

Then slice rather thin with a sharp knife and bake according to the following directions. They keep well and may be made in quantities.

Icebox Cookies

- 1 cup butter or other shortening (half of each may be used)
- 2/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 3/4 teaspoon soda dissolved in 1 teaspoon water (hot or cold)
- 3 cups flour
- 1 cup nut meats chopped or cut fine.

Cream the shortening, gradually add sugar and cream well together, add other ingredients and mix thoroughly. Form into a roll, as above, and place in cold place until ready to bake them. Slice and bake in a 400 degree oven until delicately browned. If you prefer a slower oven, use 375, but I always bake them at 400.

Any preferred nuts may be used, almonds, walnuts, pecans, black walnuts or peanuts.
