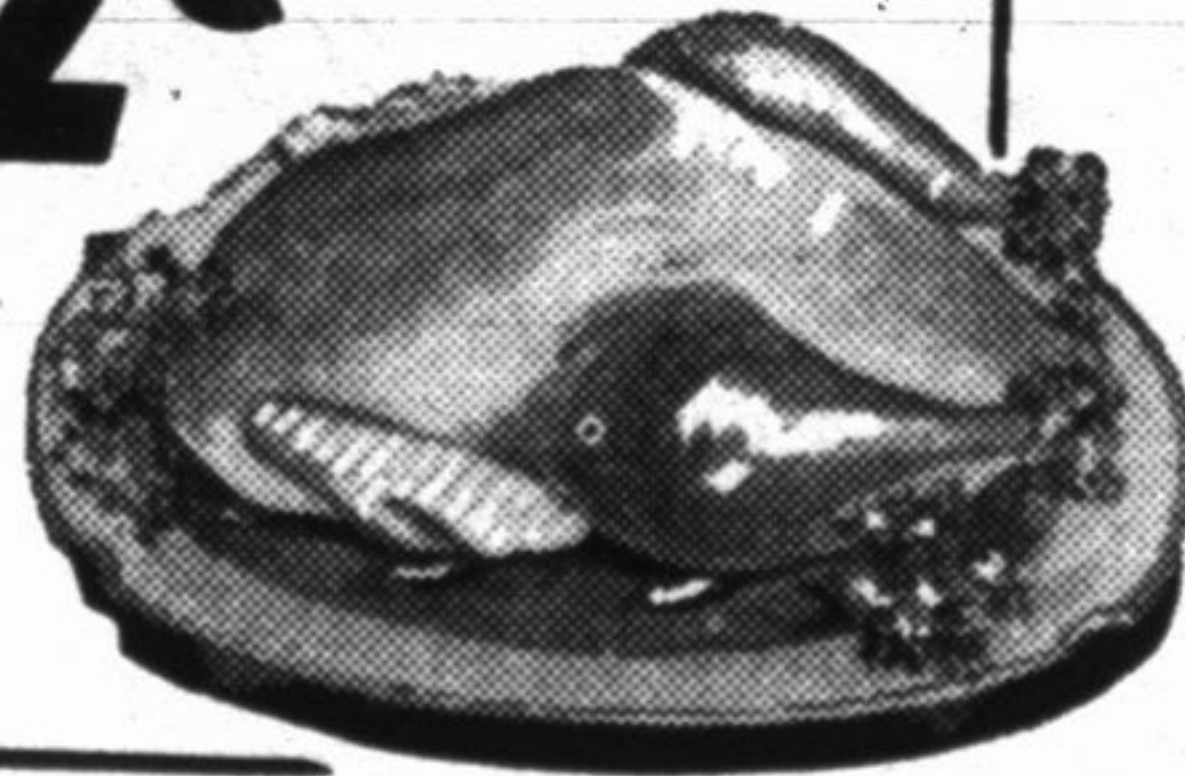
Ford Company To Put Out Two New Models
