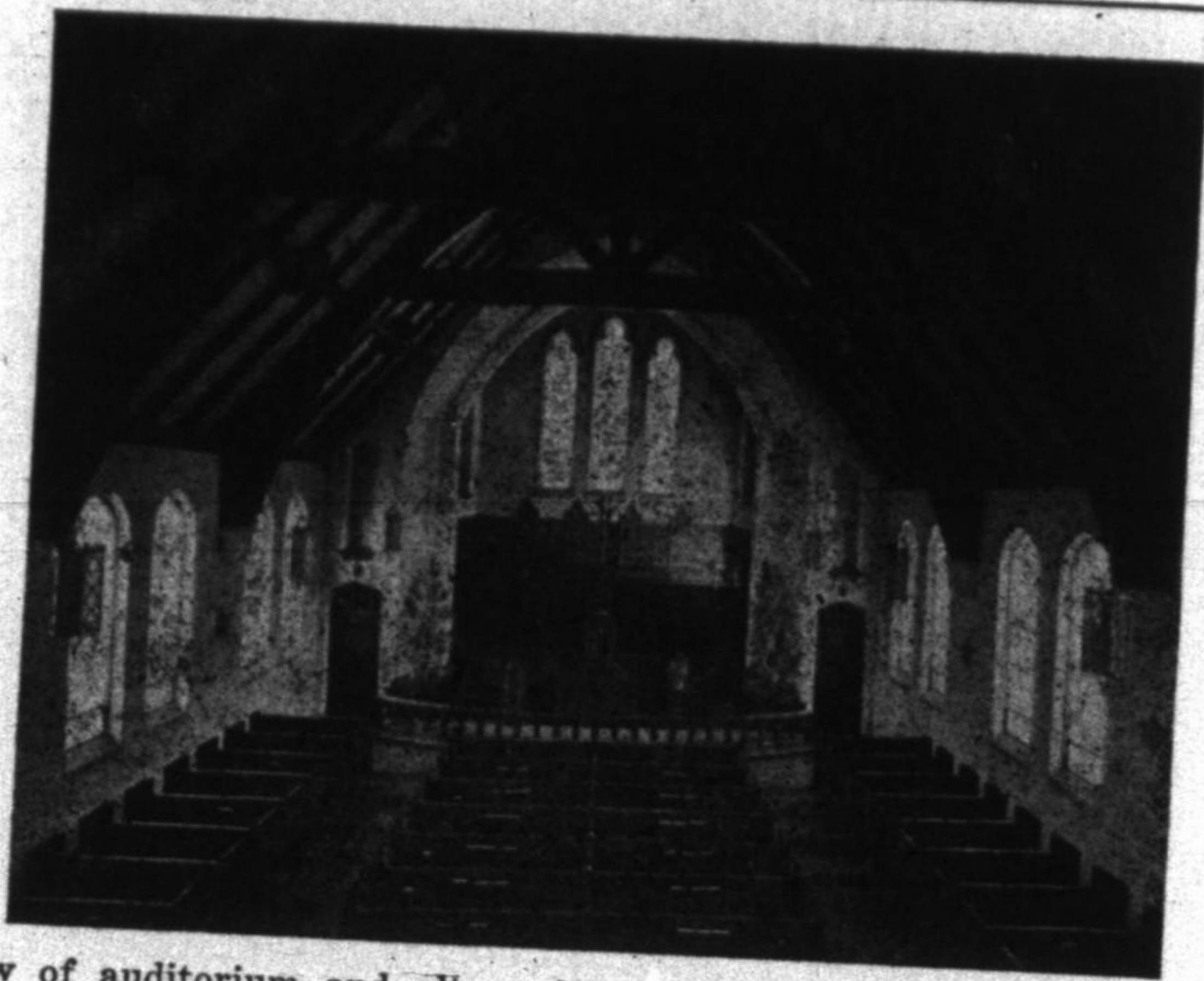


BETHANY CHURCH INTERIOR

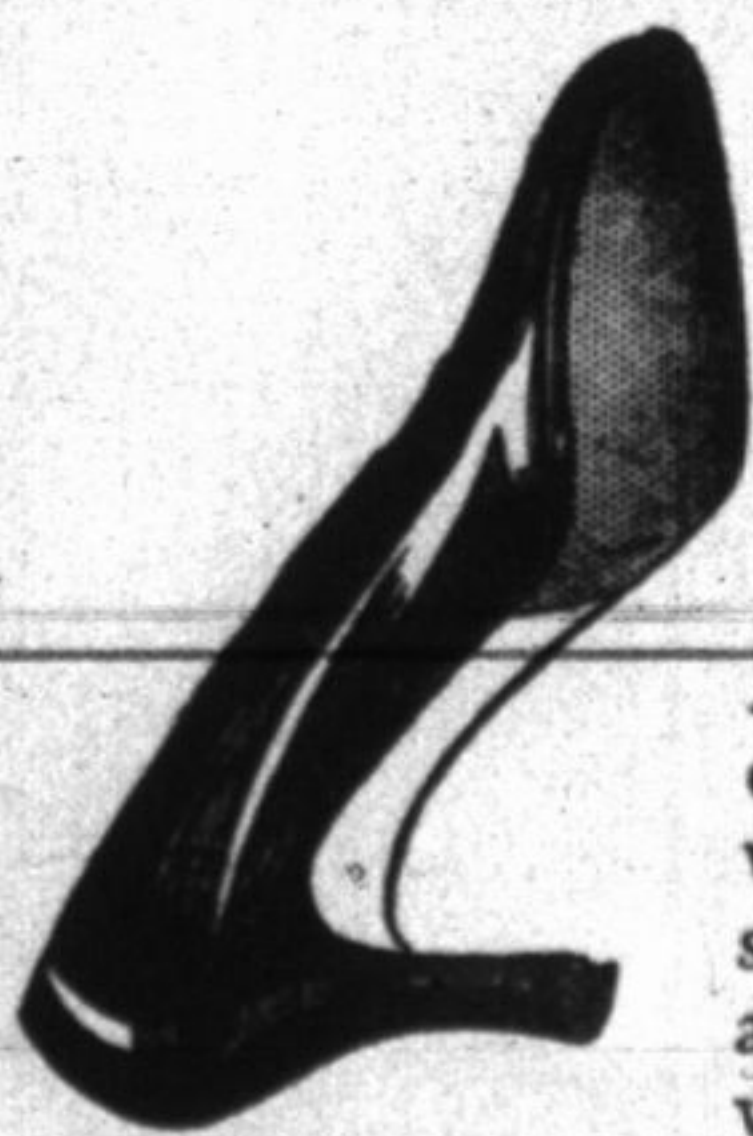
