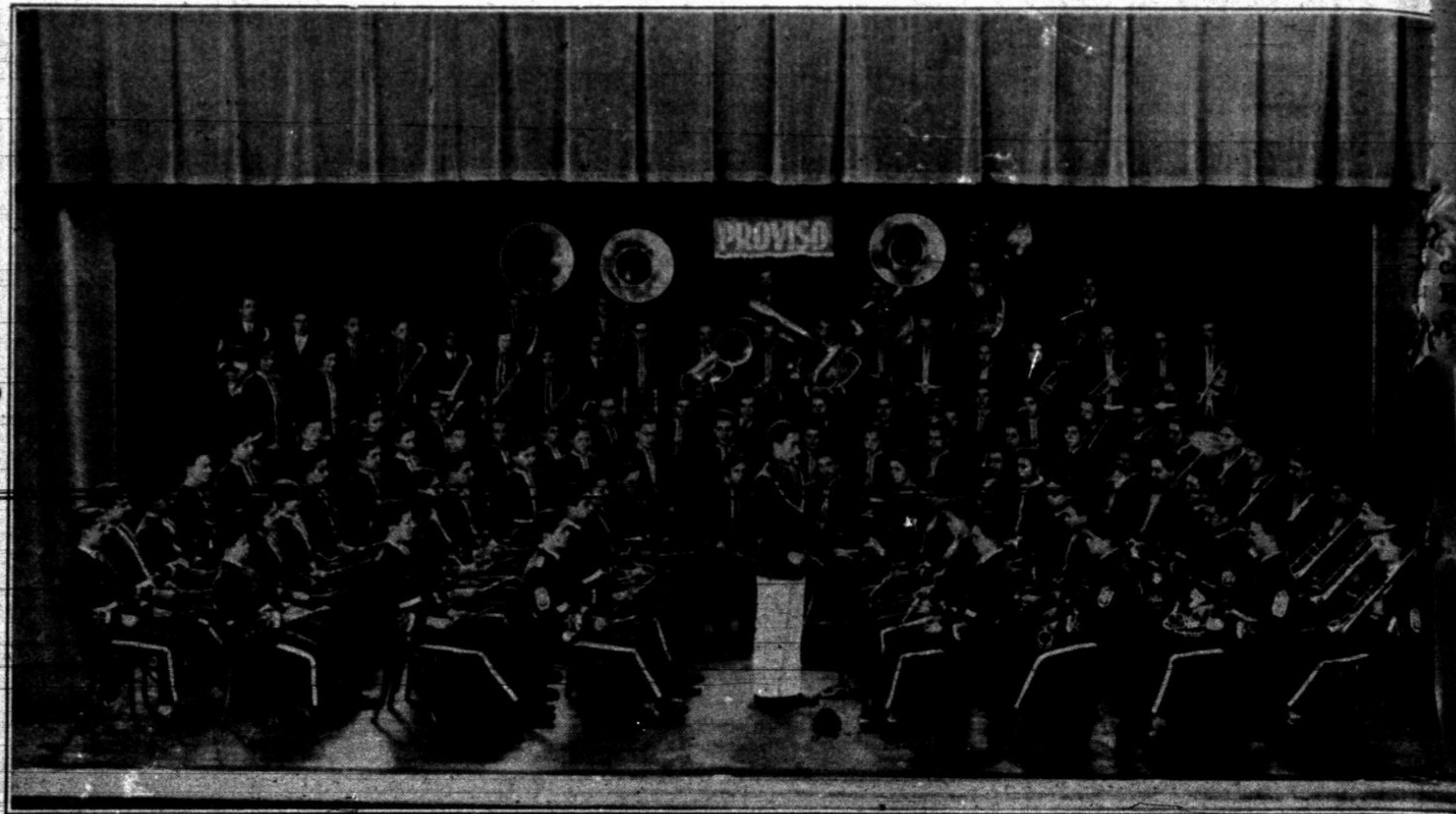

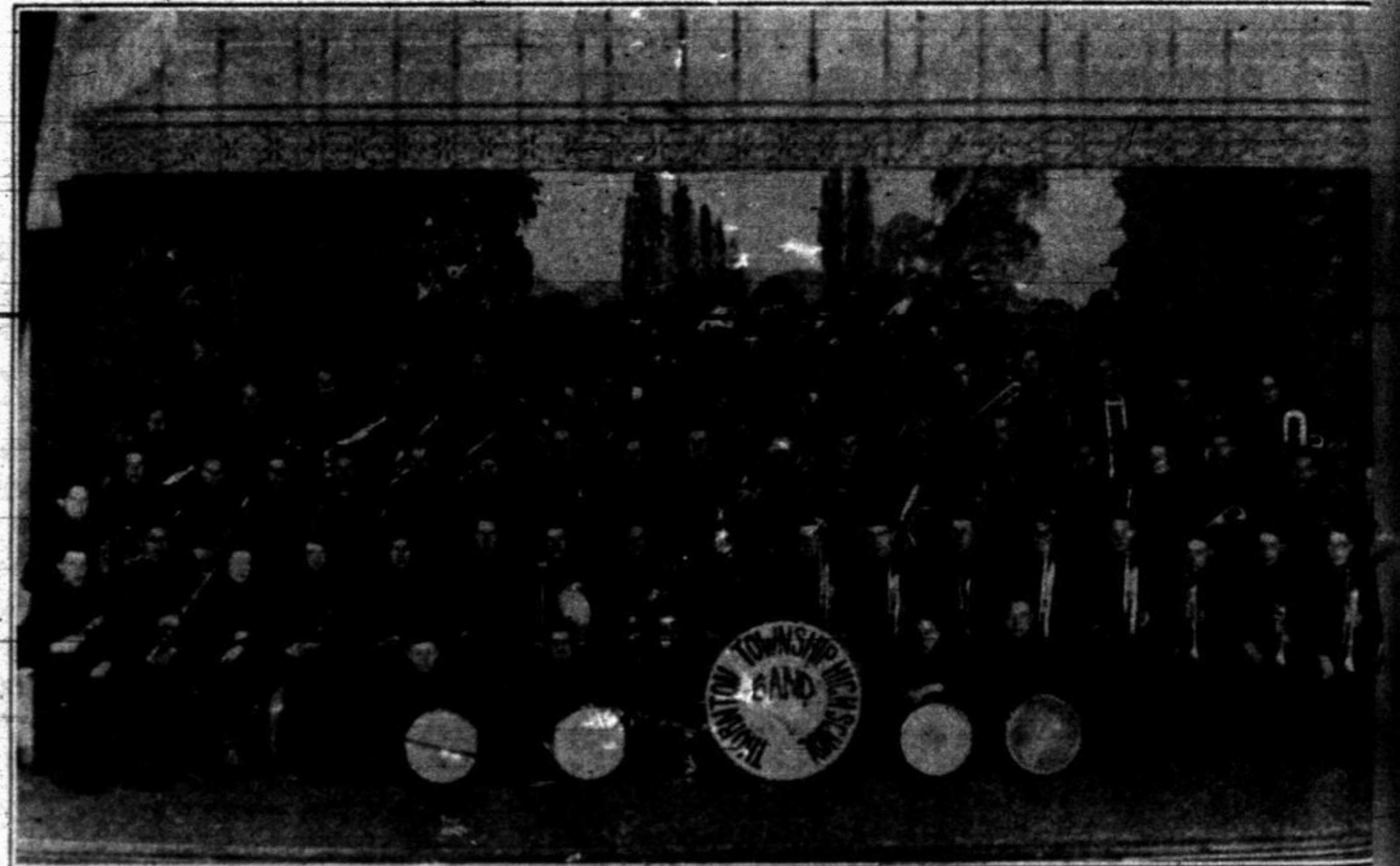

Operating Costs of High School to Be Reduced by \$14,000

At a meeting of the Deerfield-Shields high school board held on Monday evening, it was decided to cut down the number of teachers for the following year which will effect a saving of \$14,400; to suspend with the customary salary increases, and in every way to effect economy wherever possible.

While there are rumors current regarding the proposed dismissal of several members of the faculty in line with this action of the board, it is stated by officials that nothing definite has been done and that before decision regarding re-employment is reached the matter will be carefully considered by the board.

To Take No Further Steps Here on Grade Separation Project

Highland Park will take no further part in the united fight for the proposed North Shore Line grade separation project, it developed last week when a resolution was adopted by the city council recommending that the city withdraw from any further litigation.

The resolution read in part: "It is apparent that it is impossible to finance grade depression in Highland Park, as contemplated under proceedings now pending before the Illinois Commerce Commission. The city council has resolved to proceed no further at this time in the railroad grade separation proceedings or to incur any further expense for engineering services."

The battle for grade separation is one that has been carried on for the past four years or more by towns

including Highland Park, Glencoe, Winnetka, and Kenilworth.

It was indicated that the entire fight for the grade separation project will be dropped at this time following action by the Highland Park city council.
