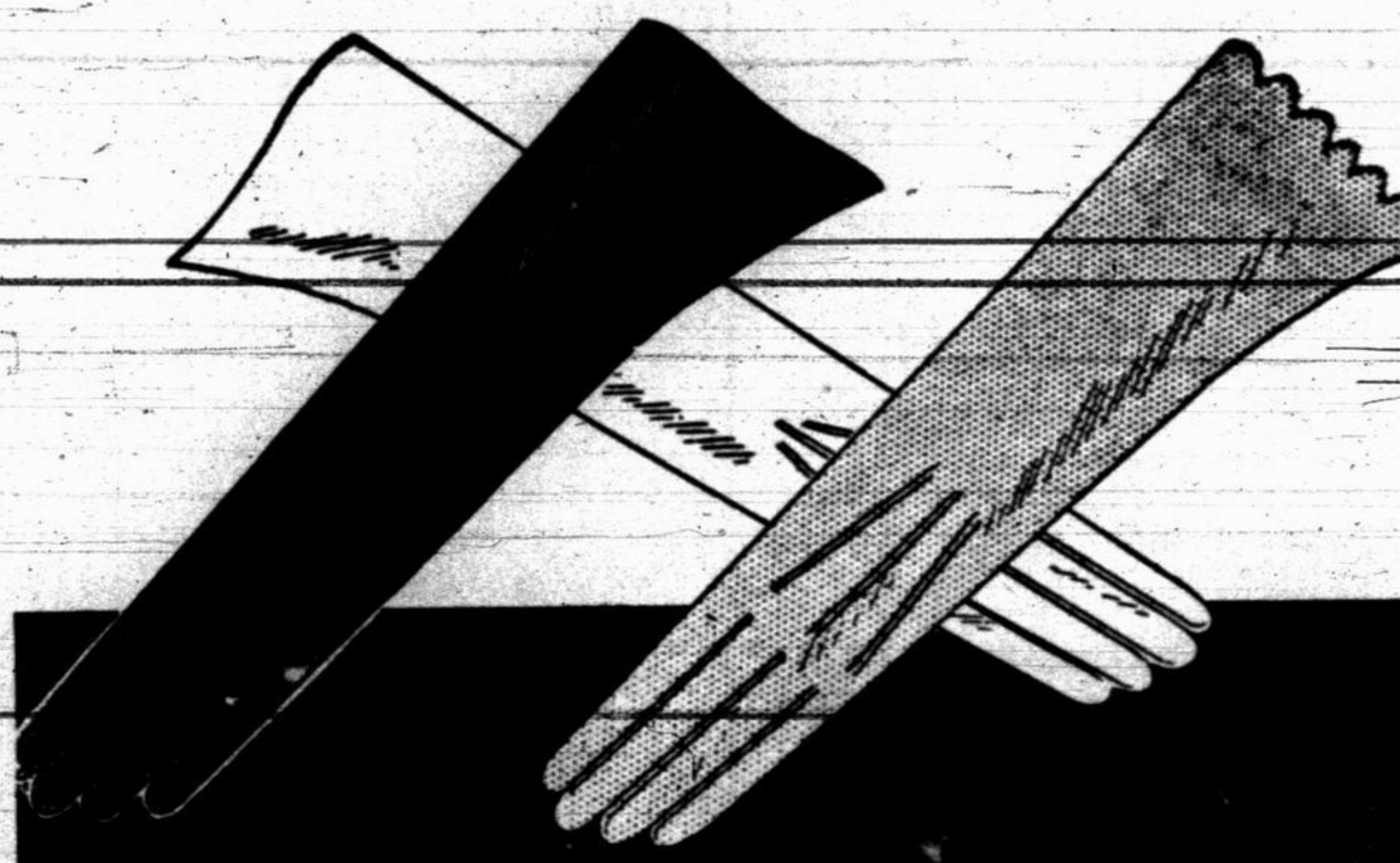
Father of Rep. Bolger Dies in Woodstock
