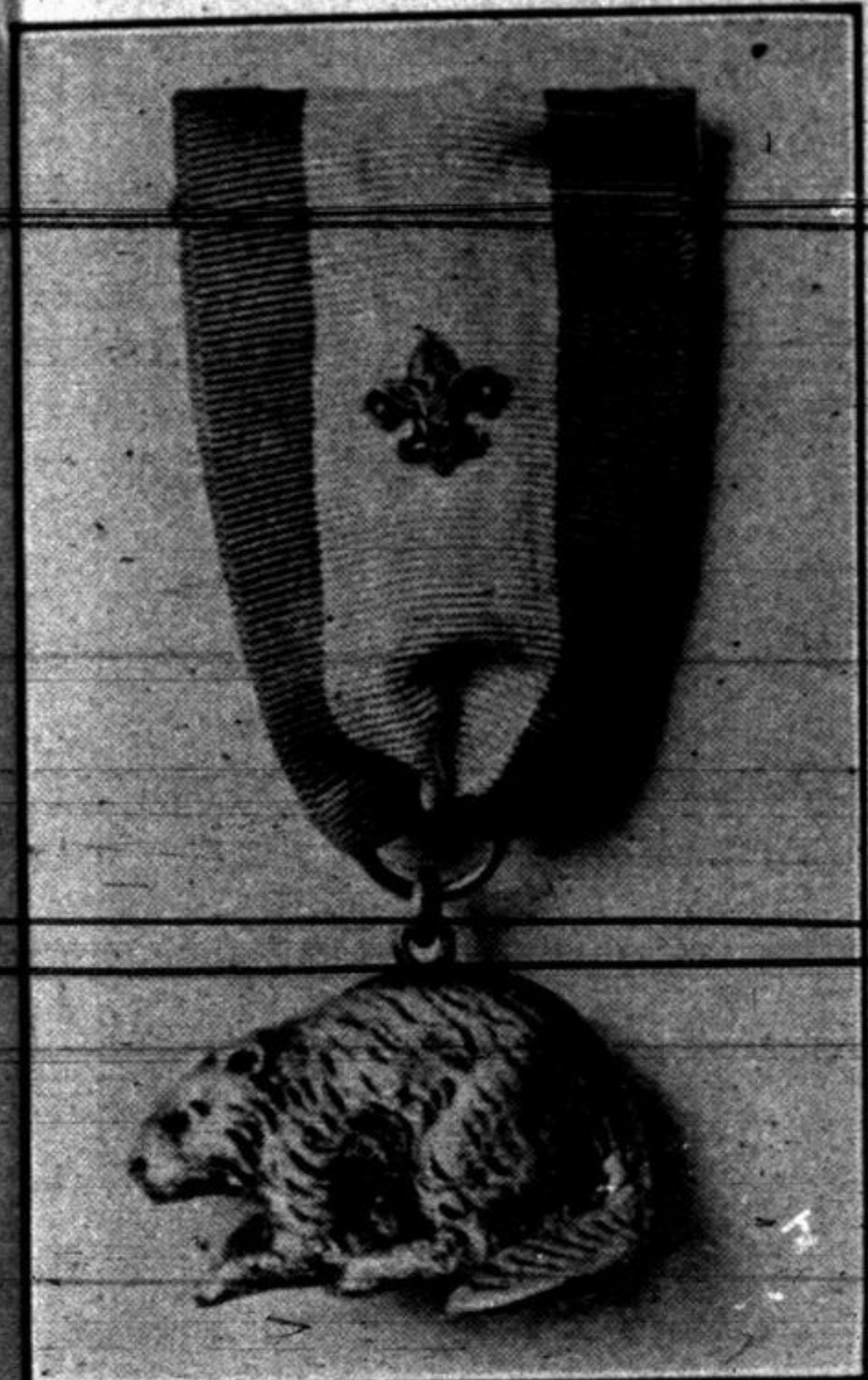

SCOUT MEDAL AWARD TO ALBERT SNITE

Silver Beaver Trophy Presented to Him for Outstanding Service to Boys

The Silver Beaver award pictured herewith was recently presented to Albert P. Snite of Highland Park in recognition of his outstanding service to boys. Mr. Snite is the father of two sons, both Eagle scouts. He has been exceedingly active in scouting on the north shore



for the past ten years. In 1921 and 1922 he was a leader in the Boy Scout drive for funds in Wilmette. Shortly after, when he moved to Highland Park, he served as member of Troop 1 committee and later as chairman of the Sea Scout Ship, Port Clinton in 1926. He furnished the Sea Scout ship the use of his boat at this time.

In 1926 Mr. Snite was instrumental in starting the North Shore Area council. He was elected president of the council in 1927 and gave a great deal of his time and effort. In 1928 he served as commissioner of the council and since 1929 has been National Council representative, representing the council at the

Mr. Snite has always been exceedingly generous in financial aid to the council. His counsel has always been sought by the members of the executive board. He took a very active part in the financial campaign in 1931 by means of which the \$20,000 indebtedness on the campsite was liquidated.

Mr. Snite has also been very active in other organizations of a civic and fraternal nature. In 1931 he was a charter member of the Masonic lodge in Wilmette, Ill.; in 1922 he was Commander of the Evanston Chapter, No. 58, Knights Templar. Since 1927 he has served as president of the Masonic Building association in Evanston.

In 1917 he served as chairman of a division in the Liberty Bond drive in Wilmette, Ill. His division over-subscribed their quota 200 per cent for which a trophy was awarded him as the most successful division chairman.

He has been president of the Illinois Association of Personal Finance companies and was elected chairman of the board of directors of the American Association of Personal Finance companies for 1931.

Mayor Petersen, as chairman of the committee will practically serve as the campaign manager in Lake county for Mr. Igoe.

Herman L. Christensen was elected as secretary while Billy Jacobs will have charge of all publicity affairs of the organization.

The headquarters of the club will be maintained at the Hotel Waukegan.

Plans for a big Igoe mass meeting to be held on March 13 are being arranged by the committee. A large dirigible balloon carrying a message on its sides will fly over the city and will be one of the features of the event.
