 When passing by on Central avenue look in at Meierhoff's hardware store and take in the message it conveys.

The center of attraction for this week is a picture of Peter's Denial, drawn by Harrach. He shows us that Peter had a sensitive conscience. The artist has drawn a strong face, but if you look closely you will see such bitterness of pain as is rarely seen. Then notice the outstretched hand that touches the wall. Peter was a laboring man, but this hand is plainly that of a man who is more than a mere laborer. Its grace and beauty bespeak a certain sensitiveness of nature that could and should lead its possessor, upon recognition of sin, to go out and weep bitterly.

"What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ?" Shall I deny Him? In the light of Peter's conduct we shall be cautious about our answer. Certainly we shall not rashly boast: "I shall never deny Thee," for that would manifest the same attitude of Simon Peter before his fall. Far better will it be to substitute a prayer for a boast, and reflecting the mind of Jesus earnestly pray:

In the hour of trial,
 Jesus, plead for me:
 Lest by base denial
 I depart from Thee;
 When Thou see'st me waver,
 With a look recall;
 Nor from fear or favor
 Suffer me to fall.
