The Wednesday luncheon-five hundred club met this week at the home of Mrs. John Haggie of West Deerfield road.

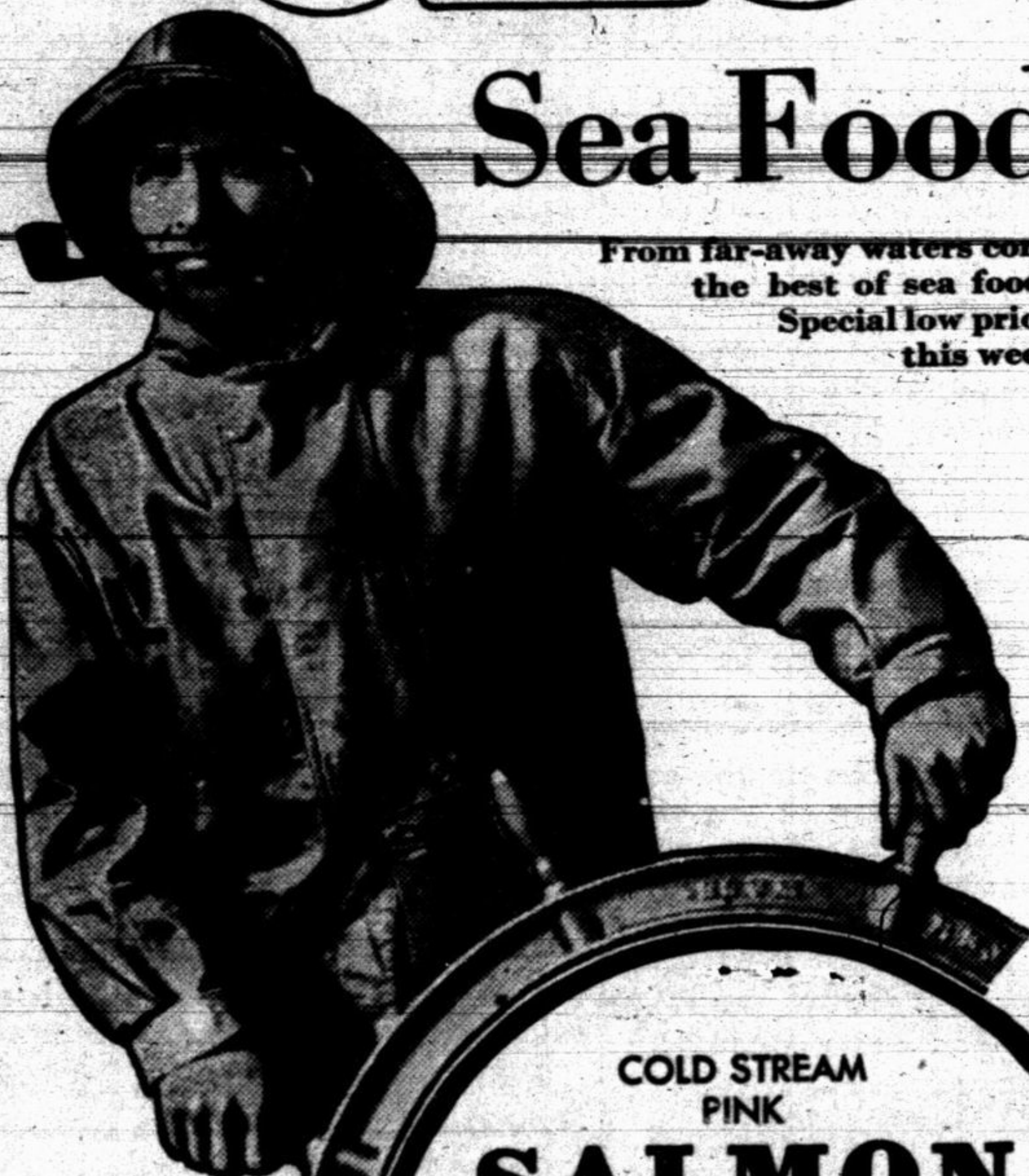
