Some one, evidently in need of wood for fuel, has removed all for sale signs in Woodland Park.

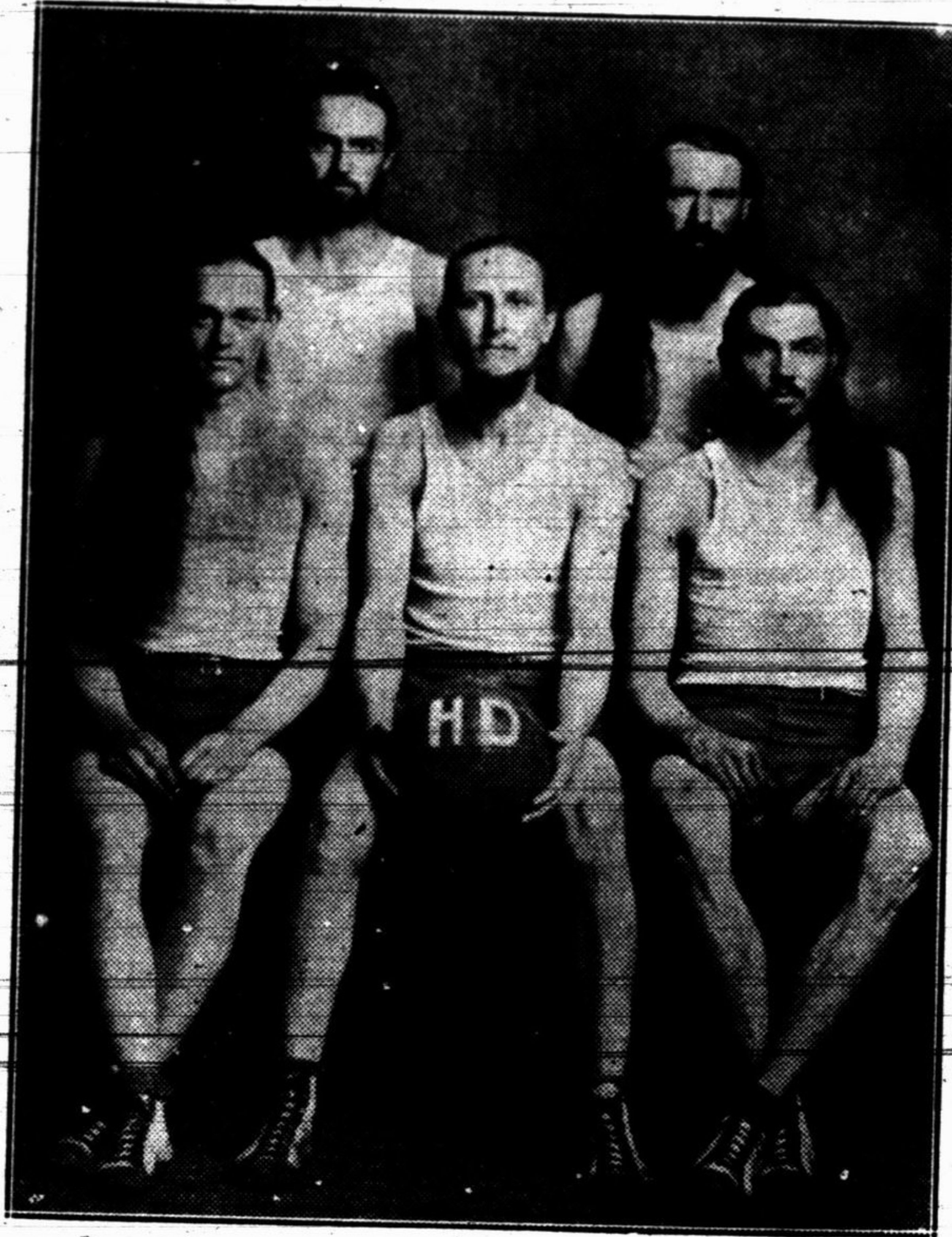
Mrs. J. W. Cooksy of Burlington, Wis., spent last week with Deerfield relatives.
