**Judge Miller Manager
of Custer Campaign in
Lake County, Announced**

Honorable Harry G. Wright, state manager for the Omer N. Custer campaign for the Republican nomination for governor at the primary, April 12, on Friday appointed Benjamin H. Miller of Libertyville, Lake county manager of the Custer campaign. Mr. Miller states that a committee is being organized, and that the campaign will be carried into every precinct of the county. He further states that the Custer campaign will be based on the business and political record of Omer N. Custer, and on his platform in which he pledges himself to a reorganization of the state government on a business basis, with a view to the reduction of the cost of government to the people. Mr. Custer favors a better distribution of taxes, so that all shall bear their share of this burden. He pledges himself to eliminate all waste and unnecessary expenditures in the management of state affairs, and to apply the strictest efficiency and economy in the functioning of the government. He believes that the taxpayer should receive a dollar value for every dollar of taxes paid, and this can only be done by cutting out all unnecessary bureaus and agencies, and lavish appropriations for unnecessary purposes. This is the only way in which confidence can be restored and business revived.

Judge Miller has had a long experience in political affairs in Lake county, and under his management, the Custer campaign will be vigorously carried on. Mr. Miller is vice-chairman of the Lake County Republican Central committee, and holds the position of supervisor of Illinois waterways.
