Judge Miller Manager of Custer Campaign in Lake County, Announced

Honorable Harry G. Wright, state manager for the Omer N. Custer campaign for the Republican nomination for governor at the primary, April 12, on Friday appointed Benjamin H. Miller of Libertyville, Lake county manager of the Custer campaign. Mr. Miller states that a committee is being organized, and that the campaign will be carried into every precinct of the county. Judge Miller has had a long experience in political affairs in Lake county, and under his management, the Custer campaign will be vigorously carried on. Mr. Miller is vicechairman of the Lake County Republican Central committee, and holds the position of supervisor of Illinois
