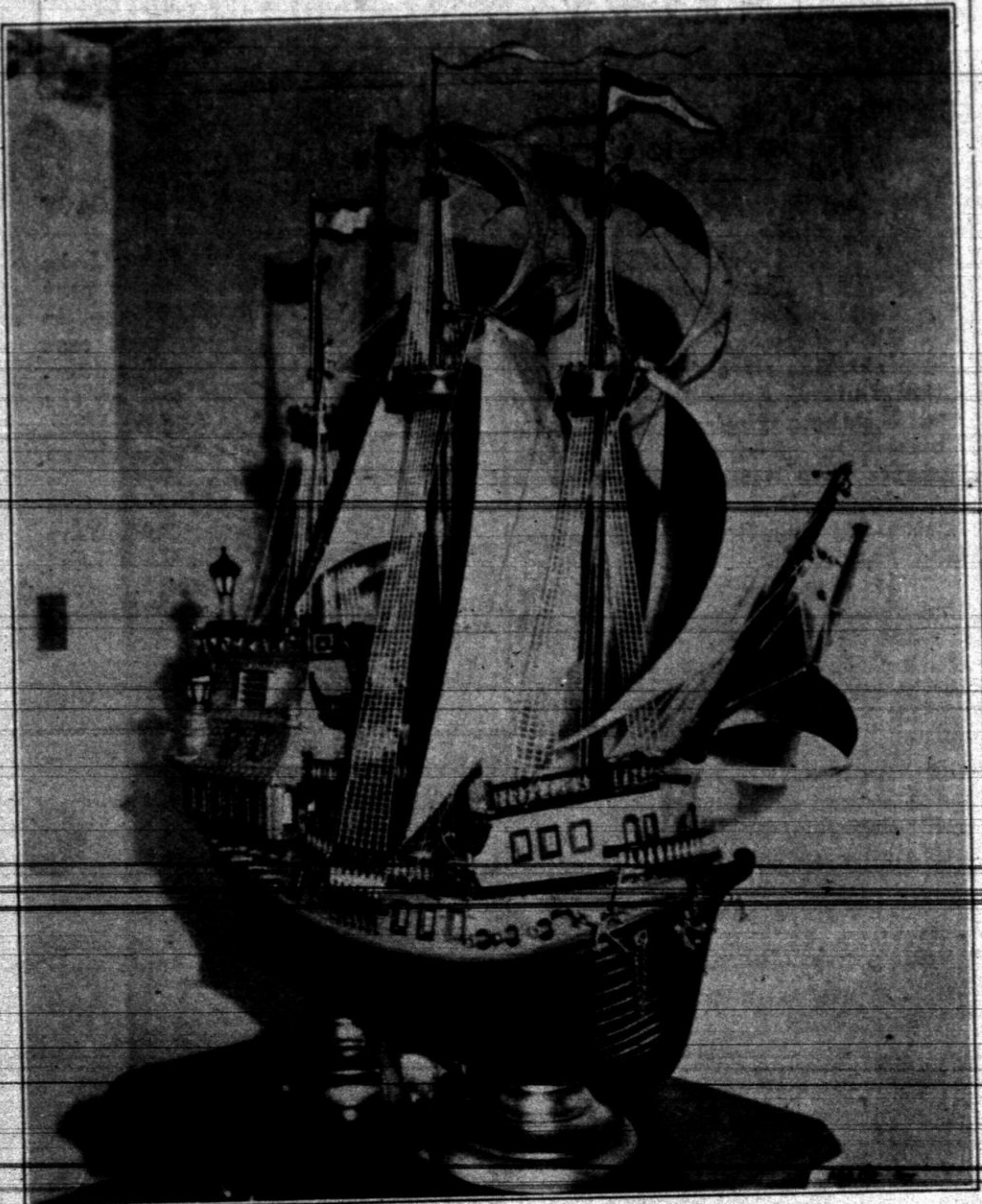


BEAUTIFUL SHIP MODEL



The following are some of the details of the building of miniature replica of the Spanish flag ship "Nuestra Senora De Rosario," on display in the window of Nield's Sport Shop. It was built by Arthur L. Brenner of Elgin, Ill.

Some thirty months ago he started this ship from the cover of a Popular Mechanics Magazine which inspired the desire to build same. Though the picture showed only a partial view, he ingeniously built the entire model from the incomplete magazine reproduction. The model stands 3½ feet high and measures approximately 29 inches in length. Included in its armament are the metal guns projecting from the sides, colorful flags which adorn the masts and there are also miniature anchors.

The body of the ship is equipped with a miniature electric light plant which supplies current to the numerous bulbs inside the cabin and to the lights which decorate the ship.

All decks are made of black wal-

nut planking; masts, yards and railings are also walnut. It has 67 windows and doors which have amber glass with a white glazed face which when lit gives a soft mellow yellow light to represent an oil lamp.

There are some 90 pulleys, single and double which are accurately made; when operating they actually work to raise and lower the sails. Other details of the ship are workmanlike and operate exactly like the rigging of full size vessels. The model is fashioned in true Spanish colors, red and yellow. The hull being red and cabins yellow with red window trim. Crows nests are the same red with yellow trim.

It is equipped with a miniature, accurately working compass on the deck which is one-fourth inch in diameter and three-fourths inches high which is mounted on a walnut pedestal.

It took Mr. Benner approximately two and one-half years to build the ship, using his spare time, holidays and Sundays. "It has proven an interesting hobby and a very enjoyable pastime," he states.
