

LOBDELL URGES ROAD WIDENING THRU FORT

Writes Letter to Mrs. McCormick in Effort to Prevent Abandonment of Plan

In an effort to avert abandonment by the state department of public works of the proposed improvement of Sheridan road through Fort Sheridan, as a result of the action of the Lake Forest city council in declining the state's offer to widen McKinley and Sheridan roads in that city. County Highway Engineer R. M. Lobdell has addressed a letter to Mrs. Rockefeller McCormick urging that she dedicate sufficient right of way along Jones place to ensure the carrying out of the state's plan.

In this letter the engineer explains the action of the Lake Forest council, which the latter says, will indefinitely delay any alteration or improvement of Route 42 through the Fort, as the State will not widen the road in the reservation so long as it must connect with a narrow outlet into Lake Forest, and also points out that if the necessary connection between McKinley road and
