Asks for Aid

Highland Park-Ravinia center of the Infant Welfare Society of Chi-

cago is asking for help for the babies of Alice H. Wood Infant Welfare station. In the best of times the babies of the poor need the help provided by the Infant Welfare society, help which they can get nowhere but from the Infant Welfare Society, if they are to have a fair chance of life and health. In this year 1932 more than ever before babies need the Infant Welfare Society to stand between them and the diseases which pray upon childhood, diseases which may easily at any time bring in their train permanent

physical defects, lifelong suffering, and dependency upon the community for support. This year more than ever before, because these helpless children are deplorably underfed, they offer fertile ground for all sorts of sickness to take its toll of suffering and death with the mounting calls for charity which sickness among the poor always brings. This year more than ever before the parents are wholly unable to give their children the right kind of care; this year more than ever before the babies need Infant Welfare's health-giving cod liver oil to supply the vitamins which they cannot get otherwise because their parents cannot buy the necessary vitamin-bearing foods.

Many Unemployed

Nurses of the Infant Welfare society who work in Alice H. Wood station estimate that at the lowest figure sixty-five per cent of the fathers of Alice H. Wood babies are unemployed and at times the unemployment ratio is ninety per cent. The children are inadequately fed, poorly clothed, and more than ever suffering from bad housing conditions because families have to double up to save rent.
