Campaign Manager Him to Be Governor date for Governor

Basing his statement on the fact that he received from all the counties of DeKalb, campaign manager Omer N. Custer, Republican, has set the date for governor, that all indications are that a plurality for Custer will carry the state counties.

"I am confident that Custer will come to Cook county a substantial plurality over other seven candidates in the Republican gubernatorial campaign," Senator V. C.
