

BELIEVES CUSTER WILL BE NOMINEE

Campaign Manager Expects Him to Be G.O.P. Candidate for Governor

Basing his statement on reports received from all sections of Illinois, State Senator Harry G. Wright of DeKalb, campaign manager for Omer N. Custer, Republican candidate for governor, today declared that all indications point to a large plurality for Custer in the down-state counties.

"I am confident that Mr. Custer will come to Cook county line with a substantial plurality over the other seven candidates who are seeking the Republican nomination for governor," Senator Wright said. "Although he got into the campaign much later than some of the other candidates, his strength has been growing by leaps and bounds. Conservative estimates made by the various county managers indicate that he will carry the great majority of the counties of the state.

In Cook County

"In Cook county, Mr. Custer's strength has been increasing daily, particularly since the beginning of his speaking tour in Chicago last week.

"It is evident at this time that the battle is between Mr. Custer and former Governor Len Small, and our reports indicate that the support of the latter is rapidly drifting away from him.

"At all of his down-state meetings Mr. Custer was greeted by large audiences. There has been a substantial growth in Custer sentiment in all of these communities, indicating the strength of his appeal to the voters.

Business Career

"His growing popularity is due primarily to the fact that he is the type of a man who should be elected as Governor of the state in the trying period which confronts the people. He is a business man of recognized standing and ability. Starting out in life as a poor boy, during the thirty-eight years he has lived in Galesburg he has established a reputation for business ability, fairness and honesty which have won the admiration of all who know him. He publishes one of the most influential newspapers down-state, is president of the largest banks outside of Chicago and is actively interested in a number of industrial concerns. When he was treasurer of Knox county in 1906 he established a record by being the first county treasurer in the state to return to the treasury all of the interest earned on public funds. During his two terms as state treasurer he was efficient and honest in his administration of that trust, and unlike one of his principal opponents, returned interest money to the state without having to be sued for it.

"He would bring to the office of governor a ripe experience, both in private and public life, which would be invaluable to the people in the working out of the various problems resulting from the present bankruptcy of governments and chaos in taxation."

hair soaked in water, should become a snake, inside three days the whole scientific world would be at the experimenter's door."

Miss Cramer then described how natural interests become the natural sciences.

Explains Methods

Mr. Bert Leech, instructor in the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades explained how and such subjects as air, water and weather are presented to the children in their scientific aspects but with special application to life as the children see it. He presented drawings which the children had made to illustrate their understanding of such matters as the city water works. Subjects as these are the topic of winter study and field trips are the center of interest in warmer weather.

Miss Ellen Guiney, custodian of the telescope which was installed at Elm Place a year ago, discussed the practical uses of the study of astronomy in the elementary school. She told how and why the sun was the only heavenly body that could influence climate on earth and amused her listeners by showing how impossible it was for a tilted moon to have an influence on rain-fall, or the order in which the planets move to have an influence on human destiny.
