character of the course considerably altered by this important new arrangement. The new tenth is a par four, as was the old, but it is 65 yards longer, and considerably better arranged to penalize a poor shot and reward fine play. The new eleventh is also a big improvement.

The drive for members is meeting with excellent results, and it appears that the membership this season will be even greater than last year. Sunset Valley has earned the name of being one of the finest municipal golf courses in the United States, for the policy of the Park board has been to reinvest all profits from the course in improvements. The course now measures more than 6,500 yards in length, and is a real test of golf. But while the course is difficult, its hazards are not too great a burden for the average golfer.

The requirements of the man who occasionally breaks a hundred and is more often above that figure have been the measuring stick in laying out the eighteen hole course. While the par shooters find plenty of difficulty in bettering par figures, the course gives the average golfer a break. The difficulties penalize poor shots, but they do not inflict on the golfer impossible situations.

The low rate for a season's play is proving attractive to golfers from as far as down-town Chicago, and among the out of town members already added to the list are several whose residences are on the near North side.

Apply Early

Residents of Highland Park should send in their applications for membership at once and get full advantage of the season's play this spring, summer and fall. Application blanks may be had at the club offices on the course, and new members residing in Highland Park will be able to play at once without green fees if they sign an application and pay their season's dues. Out of town memberships are limited.

So shine up the old clubs and get busy. Old man-par is calling you, and Sunday is as good as any time to begin this season's activities. All members are requested to turn in their score cards after their first day's play, and to turn in cards for every round, in order that the handicappers may prepare for the tournament season which opens May 30.
