Ravinia Reading Club Hears "San Michele" Review by Mrs. Clock

Mrs. Irving Clock gave a most brilliant review of Munthe's "San Michele" at the Ravinia Reading club last Monday.

The book has many stories interesting as expositions of character, gruesome in parts, but artistic and beautiful on the whole.

Mrs. Clock describes the characters minutely, and makes them live in the scene which surrounds them, whether in Capri or Paris. She is sympathetic in her feelings for the poor peasant as well as the character in higher life, and reveals them to her listeners not as mere puppets but real specimens of humanity. She does not dwell morbidly or oppressively on the mundane aspects in the stories but lifts out the bright and happy episodes for our inspection and dwells with affection on the sublime descriptions, the kindnesses the author showers on peasant and beast alike, and the spiritual atmosphere which permeates sections of the book.

Mrs. Clock has a faculty of leaving with her audience a desire for the best in books, and creates in her hearers an inclination for the reading of clever and brilliant literature.

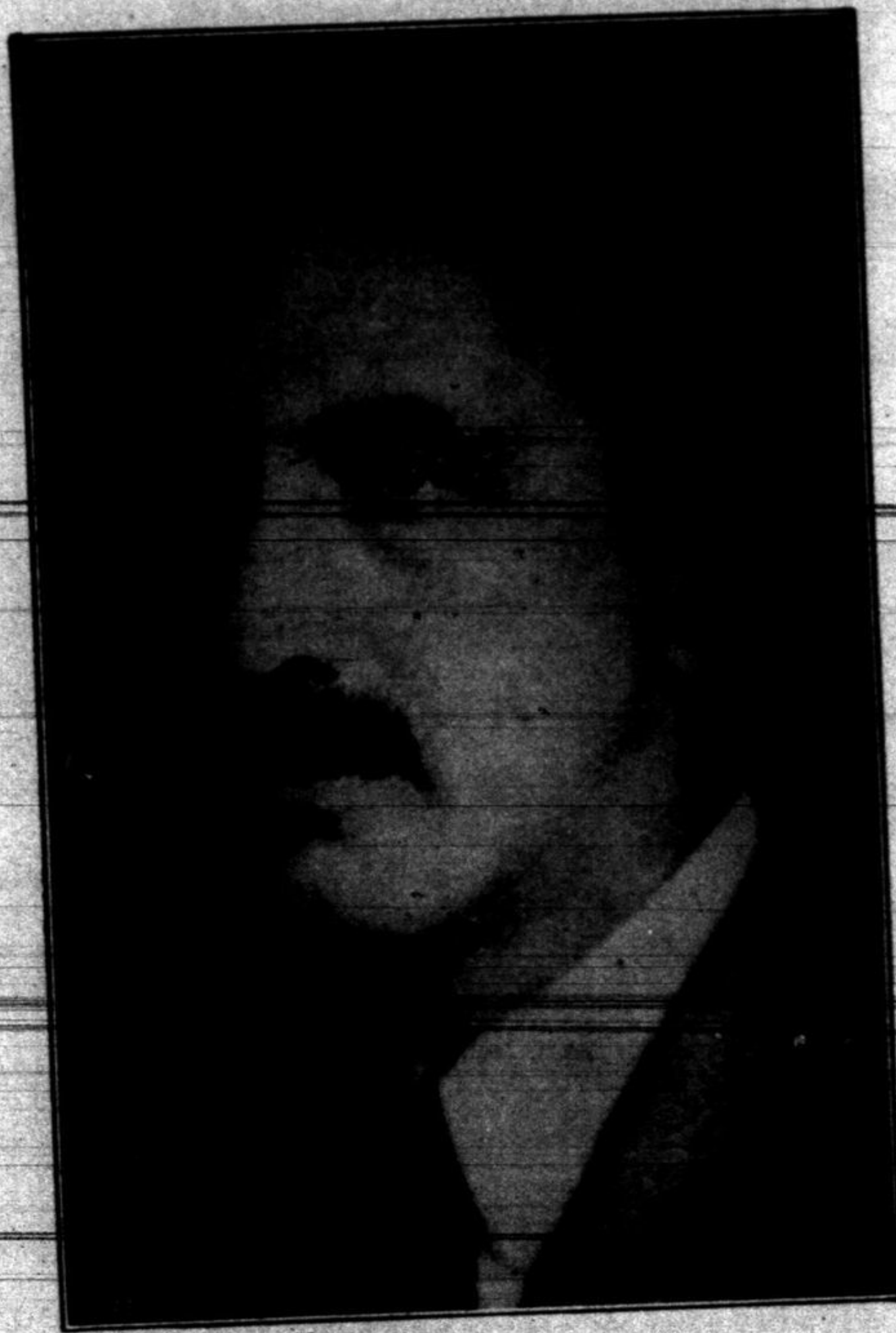
