

Estimate Is 946,885 Men and Women: Pay Total Over Billion Dollars

Uncle Sam's payroll has upon it the names of 946,885 men and women. They receive an average annual wage of \$1,575, for a total payroll of approximately \$1,494,000,-000, according to estimates of the burea of the budget, says a United States report from Washington, D.C.

Total 946,885 Continued Increase

Despite reductions in the size of the army, navy and marine corps, the number of names on federal payrolls has increased every year since 1927. The number employed today is greater than at any time since the years of and immediately after the war.

The total departmental and office employment last June was 40 per cent greater than that of June 1916.

The total of 946,885 government employees does not include hundreds of thousands of others who, indirectly, are paid with Federal funds. The great majority of those paid indirectly are hired by contractors, who are at work on government projects. The number is variously estimated from half a million upwards.


