The climax of this evening's experience undoubtedly will come when Miss Belle Sherwin, national president, gives her annual address.

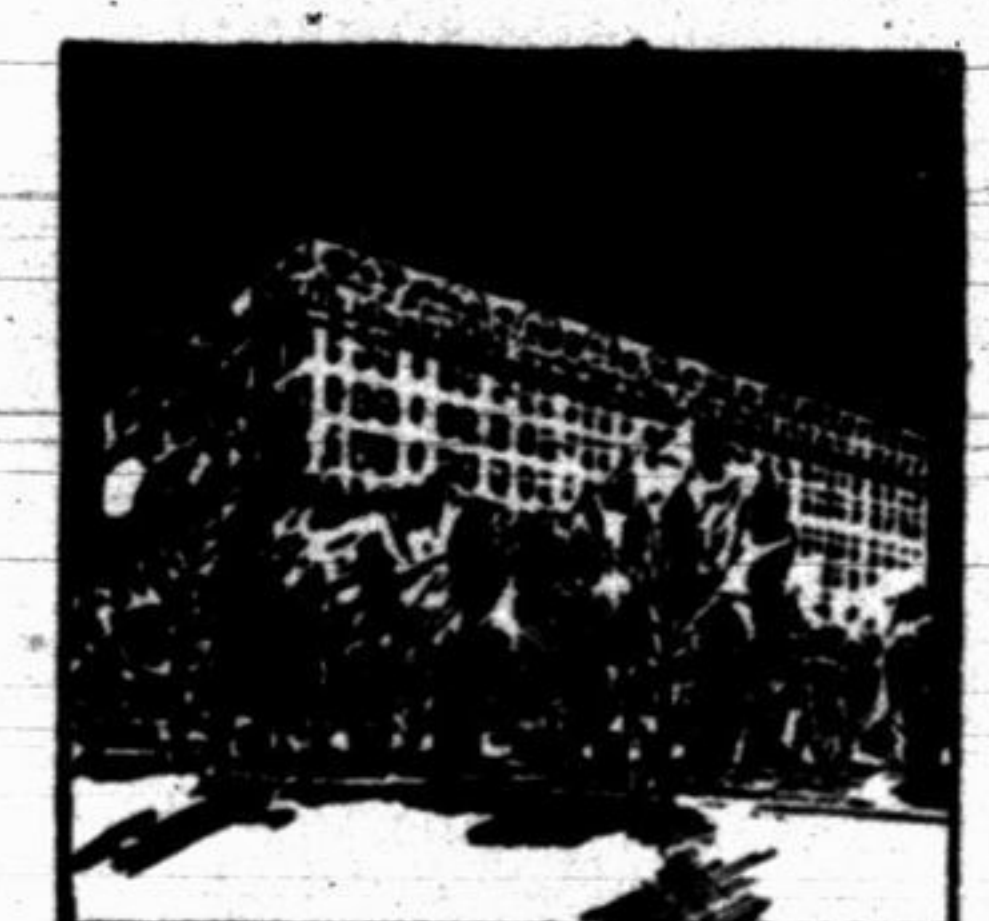
