EMBERSHIPS in the Sunset Valley Golf Club are available to residents of Highland Park this season for the first time on partial payments.

A first payment of \$10 with the application, and the balance at your convenience within sixty days, will entitle you to play at once on this sporty eighteen hole course.

This offer will hold good only until May 15th, after which applications will be received only with full payment of membership fees and dues.

The Sunset Valley Golf Club is Highland Park's own country club. It is NOT a daily fee course. It offers to the residents of this city and a few selected non-residents a modern course of championship length, (6,504 yards, par 72), with the facilities of a private club, at moderate cost. It brings golf within reach of every Highland Park family.


From a small beginning, with nine rather sketchy holes, the Sunset Valley course has developed into an eighteen hole test of championship golf, and one which extends the abilities of internationally famous players every year in the annual North Shore Open Championship.

Eligibility

All residents of Highland Park, from the age of twelve years upwards, are eligible for membership in the Sunset Valley Golf Club. Fees, quoted elsewhere on this page, are the most attractive to be found in the district at any club comparable to our community course. There are also a limited number of memberships open to non-residents at slightly higher rates, but still at a most which, when reduced to the outgo per round, is ridiculously low.

The Course

The eighteen holes of the Sunset Valley Golf course are located on a tract of land just south of Deerfield Road in the Skokie Valley. WHAT DOES IT COST?

EVERY resident of Highland Park is eligible for membership in the Sunset Valley Golf Club. The fees, whether for season membership or daily play, are exceedingly moderate.

SEASON MEMBERSHIPS

Class X Membership-Resident member and one woman member of his or her immediate family over 21 years of age, \$31.50.

Class A-A resident member over 21 years of age, \$25.00.

Class B-A resident member between the ages of 16 and 21 years, \$15.00.

Class C-A resident member between the ages of 12 and 16 years, \$6.00.

Special Note-A limited number of non-residents may secure memberships and will be designated as XX, AA, and BB. This privilege may be withdrawn at the option of the Park Board. Current rates will be furnished on application.

Class X and A membership have preference over Class B and Class C memberships. Class C memberships are for play only on week-day mornings and not at all on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

GREEN FEES

For residents of the Highland Park East Park District: week days, 75c per day; Saturday, Sunday and holidays, \$1.25 per day. 50c on week-day evenings after 5:00 p.m. Non-residents whose registration is accepted, \$1.00 on week days; \$2.00 all day Saturday and on afternoons of Sundays and holidays; \$2.50 on forenoon of Sundays and holidays; \$1.50 on Sunday and holiday afternoons after 3:00 p.m.

Registration

Club members may reserve time at the first tee throughout the season. Starting time otherwise is regulated by the order of appearance at the first tee. On Saturday afternoons and Sundays Mr. Kelly personally supervises the play from the first tee.

Caddies

Expert caddies, all of them fine, attentive lads who live in Highland Park, are available at all times. Under the direction of a caddy master the boys are trained to the duties of a caddy. The club is proud of its boys, many of whom hold junior memberships. The fees are moderate, the charge being \$1 for eighteen holes for Class A caddies, and eighty cents for Class B caddies. Other charges are in proportion with these rates. Caddies for practice receive a fee of forty cents an hour or twenty-five cents a half hour. A member may ask for the caddy of his choice, provided the boy is not previously engaged.
