AN ORDINANCE Providing for the Issuance of Park Bonds

THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT in the sum of

Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) and Providing for the payment Thereof.

WHEREAS, The Highland Park East Park District is a duly organized Park District under the laws of the State of Illinois, and is charged with the duty of acquiring and maintaining a public park or parks in said district; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary, for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of land condemned or purchased for parks or boulevards, and for the building, maintaining, improving and protecting of the same, and for the payment of the expenses incident thereto, that there be borrowed Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) and that bonds be issued therefor,

NOW. THEREFORE, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the price of such lands, improvements and the maintenance thereof,

Be It Ordained by the Board of Park Commissioners of The Highland Park East Park District, of Lake County, Illinois;
