deceitful hole. Trees cut into the fairway on the left at about 220 yards from the tee. Out of bounds to the left for the tee shot. A clump of trees at the right penalizes a slice, these hazards all placing a premium on a well-placed and hard hit drive. A clump of bushes takes care of approaches which over-run the green.

Hole 14. 210 yards. Par 3. At first glance the hole looks easy, but pesky little sand trap to the right of the green catches many a well-intentioned tee-shot. Out of bounds and trees on the left, and a deep ditch add to the sporting qualities of the hole. Not an easy par.

Hole 15. 400 yards. Par 4. Here we meet our old friend the Skokie ditch for the last time. It crosses the fairway in front of the tee. Out of bounds on the left, bad rough to catch a topped shot, and trees and sand on the right are plenty of trouble for one hole. But that's not all the bad news. A large oak grows in the center of the fairway at about 235 yards from the tee. Drives should be placed to right or left to assure a clear shot to the green. The hole is well trapped and the green in excellent condition.

Hole 16. 403 yards. Par 4. Another good two-shotter. Trees at about the length of an average drive, both to right and left, and more trees on the right near to green, together with a sand trap, add to the interest. The green is small, but well kept. A sand trap on the left catches many a well-intentioned approach.

Hole 17. 500 yards. Par 5. One of the best improvements of last season was the reconstruction and trapping of this green, which now presents a major problem on the approach. The hole is a slight dog-leg to the hook side, the line determined by a clump of oaks about 265 yards from the tee. These and a stubborn rough on the right are the principal hazards until the approach shot is taken.

Hole 18. 337 yards. Par 4. The home hole. A good drive and a pitch to end the round 50 yards from the club-house.

Second nine 3260 yards. Four water holes. Par 36.

Eighteen holes, 6504 yards. Nine water holes. Par 72.

Tees and greens have been very well kept, and will be in excellent condition all season. Further improvements will be made as the money becomes available, although the course already is considered the finest community course in the vicinity of Chicago. This is due largely to the fact that greens and fairways have had excellent care and direction for a number of years, and a sufficient volume of play to provide money for improvements. The policy of putting all surplus back into the course will be continued.

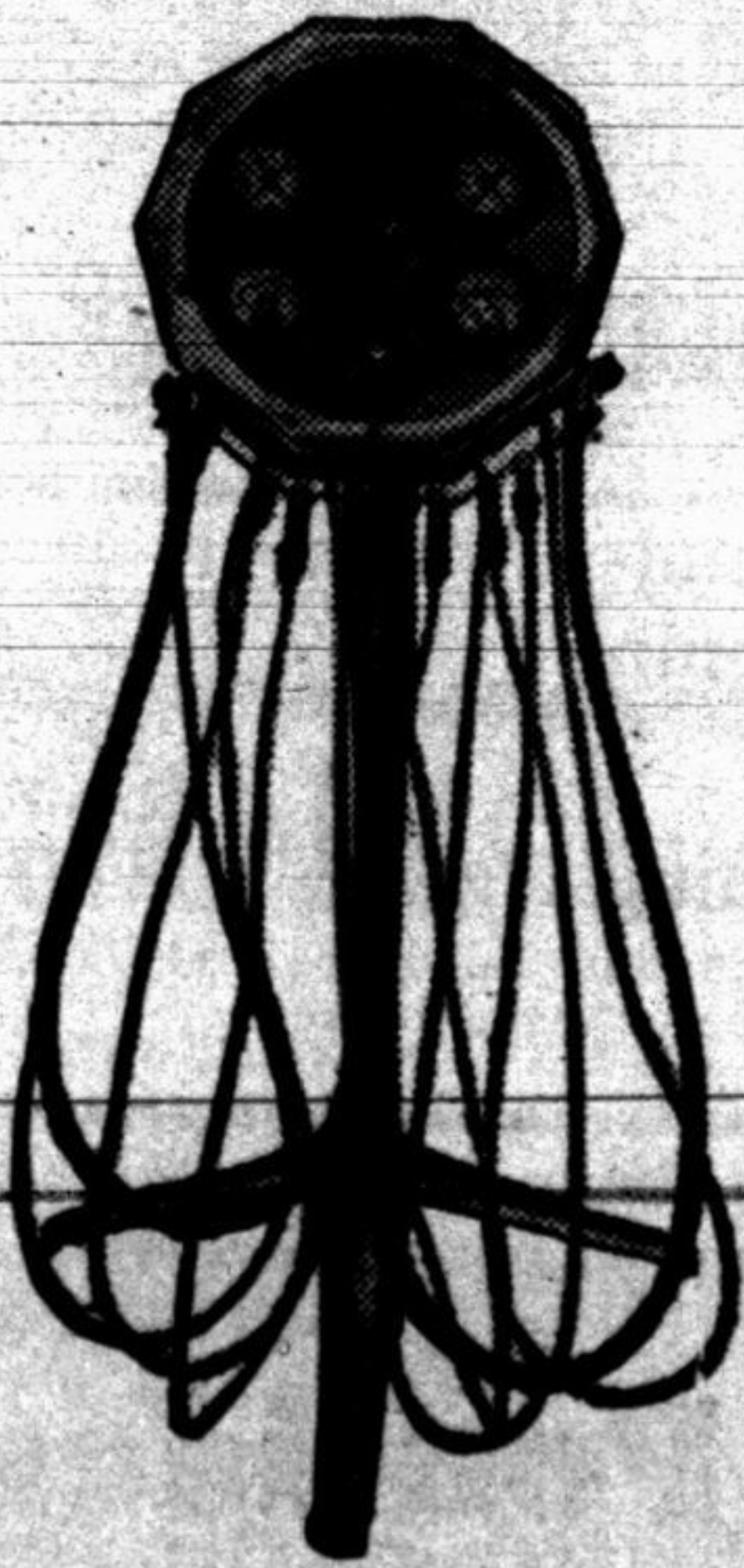
