SUGGESTS CAMP FOR "LESS CHANCE" BOYS

President N. S. Area Council of Boy Scouts Has Plan for Underprivileged

It will surprise many thoughtful people to learn that the "less chance boy" has become a problem in the social structure of the North Shore district, says Henry Fowler, president of the North Shore Area Council, Boy Scouts of America. Where he has come from and why he exists here is another subject but it suffices for present consideration that he has arrived and accordingly must be considered in the light of present day consequences unless he is to be completely ignored which must not d be permitted, according to Mr. Fowler. It is possible that in this day of contrasts he stands out distinctly on the North Shore because of the more fortunate circumstances of the majority of the boys he meets. A partially completed survey corroborated by the statements of social workers and school officials shows that these "less chance boys" are increasing in number and will continue to do so in direct ratio to population increases and a change in the people constituting it. As might be expected the "less chance boy" here has many personal qualities that makes a special appeal to those who knowing the facts, are interested in him.
