## New Ball Club Is Formed Here; Will Open Season Sunday

Baseball fans in Highland Park and surrounding vicinity will have their first chance to see "The Highland Park Pals," a newly organized ball club, in action next Sunday at Sunset park against their highly touted rivals "The Highwood Indians," at 2:30 o'clock.

Last year, through the determination and influence of "Archie" Jones, a ball club was formed in Highland Park (the first one for several years) but most of the good ball players around town had been playing with other teams particularly St. James in Highwood. This team had been a member of the "Tri County league" for the last four seasons competing against such teams as St. Anthony's in Waukegan, Northbrook, Des Plaines, etc., and they never finished below second place. This year the Highwood Indians disputed St. James' rights to the playing field in Highwood and when the St. James boys were offered a chance to combine with Highland Park's team, and play in their home town, they grasped the opportunity.

Under the direction of "Solly" Thurston, coach at Deerfield-Shields high school, "Ray" Unbeham, who built up the St. James team, and "Archie" Jones and "Abe" Carr of Highland Park, every member of the squad has been practicing very hard for the past three weeks, and all they will need from now on is a good crowd to root for them on Sunday afternoons and Highland Park is assured of one of the best amateur baseball teams in the state.

A; 38%, B; 37%, C; 7%, D; 3%, E. The normal curve is 7% A, 24% B, 38% C, 24% D, and 7% E.

### Only One Failure

A further analysis of the 3% semester hours of failure discloses that only one student who had received the recommendation of the high school for college had failed in any subject. This one failure was in a three hour course. The remaining twenty-three semester hours were failed by students whom colleges had accepted in spite of the fact that the high school refused to recommend them.

From Harvard, Princeton, Mount Holyoke no grade below C was reported; 21% of the semester hours were of a grade of A, 45% were of a grade of B, and 34% were of a grade of C. At Bowdoin all work was of a passing grade. Three semester hours of failure marred an otherwise good record at Dartmouth.

At the state universities of Wisconsin, Michigan, and Illinois, an average of B is maintained by the Deerfield-Shields graduates. This is true of Northwestern also where no grade below C was reported.

### In Smaller Colleges

The smaller schools, De Pauw, Elmhurst, Lawrence college, Maryville college, Northern State Teacher's college, Ripon, and Wheaton report no grade below C. Miami, Rockford, and Stephen report all passing grades. At Lewis institute an average between B and C with no failures is maintained.

Particular pride is taken in those students who secured nothing but honor grades for the first semester. Among those are John Derby at De Pauw with no grade below 90; Gertrude Fisher at Elmhurst; Marjorie Frye at Northwestern; Edwin Ball at Purdue; Rena Nelson at the University of Wisconsin; Isabel Danley and Grace Meier at the University of Illinois.
