

## Kite Flyers Warned to Avoid Electric Wires; Danger Pointed

Would-be "Benjamin Franklins" in North Shore towns are warned of the dangers of high tension wires, by Public Service officials.

Many boys in the city are flying kites with thin copper wire for string. These may fall across high tension wires or street car wires and

result in a serious accident, it was pointed out.

Last year a young Racine kite-flyer narrowly escaped death when the copper cord to which his kite was attached fell across a 123,000 volt transmission line. The high voltage fortunately burned up the wire before current reached the boy.

## Motor Club Points Numerous Vacation Possibilities Open

"Where shall we pass our vacation?" is to many motorists an annual question which the Chicago Motor club seeks to answer by means of a list of destinations which have proved their popularity.

In compiling the list, the club included round trip mileage by motor with Chicago as the starting and finishing point, and the average reasonable period for driving, sight-seeing and sojourning. These periods, the club added, may be lengthened or shortened, depending upon driving speed and length of time at the destination. The suggestions follow:

"The most popular national parks in the west are Yellowstone, open June 20 to Sept. 19, 2,944 miles, three weeks; Grand Canyon, always open, 3,900 miles, four weeks; Rocky Mountain, always open, 2,300 miles, two weeks; Yosemite, always open, 4,870 miles, four to five weeks; Mount Rainier, open June 15 to Sept. 15, 4,830 miles, five weeks, and Zion park and Bryce National Monument, both open June 1 to Sept. 30, 3,800 miles, four weeks.

### Other Western Points

"Other western points comprise Banff and Lake Louise, 4,600 miles, five weeks; Bad Lands and Black Hills, 2,000 miles, two weeks; Colorado Springs and vicinity, 2,700 miles, two weeks, and Carlsbad cavern, 3,250 miles, three weeks. Southern vacation centers popular in summer are Great Smoky Mountains national park, 1,450 miles, ten days, and Hot Springs national park, 1,600 miles, one week.

"Southeastern, eastern and northeastern destinations are Washington, Philadelphia and New York, 1,872 miles two weeks; Niagara Falls, 1,064 miles, one week; New England states, 2,416 miles, three weeks; Montreal and Quebec, 2,100 miles, two weeks, and the maritime provinces of Canada, 3,700 miles, three weeks. Also, many motor to the Minnesota Arrowhead country, 1,600 miles, ten days; Upper Peninsula of Michigan, 835 miles, one week, and last, but no less popular than ever, a tour around Lake Michigan, 980 miles, one week. Many of the tours mentioned can be combined without adding greatly to the mileage or time."

## Hastings in Warning Against Dangers of Bonus Payment Now

Expressing fear that it would throw the nation into bankruptcy, Samuel M. Hastings, of Highland Park, president of the Midwest Manufacturers' Associations, Inc., last week urged industrialists to oppose the full payment of the soldiers' bonus, says a press story from Chicago.

Hastings, who is also president of the Illinois Manufacturers' Association, pointed out that the Illinois group had already gone on record opposing the proposed payment.

The larger organization includes industrial groups in Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kansas, and Nebraska.
