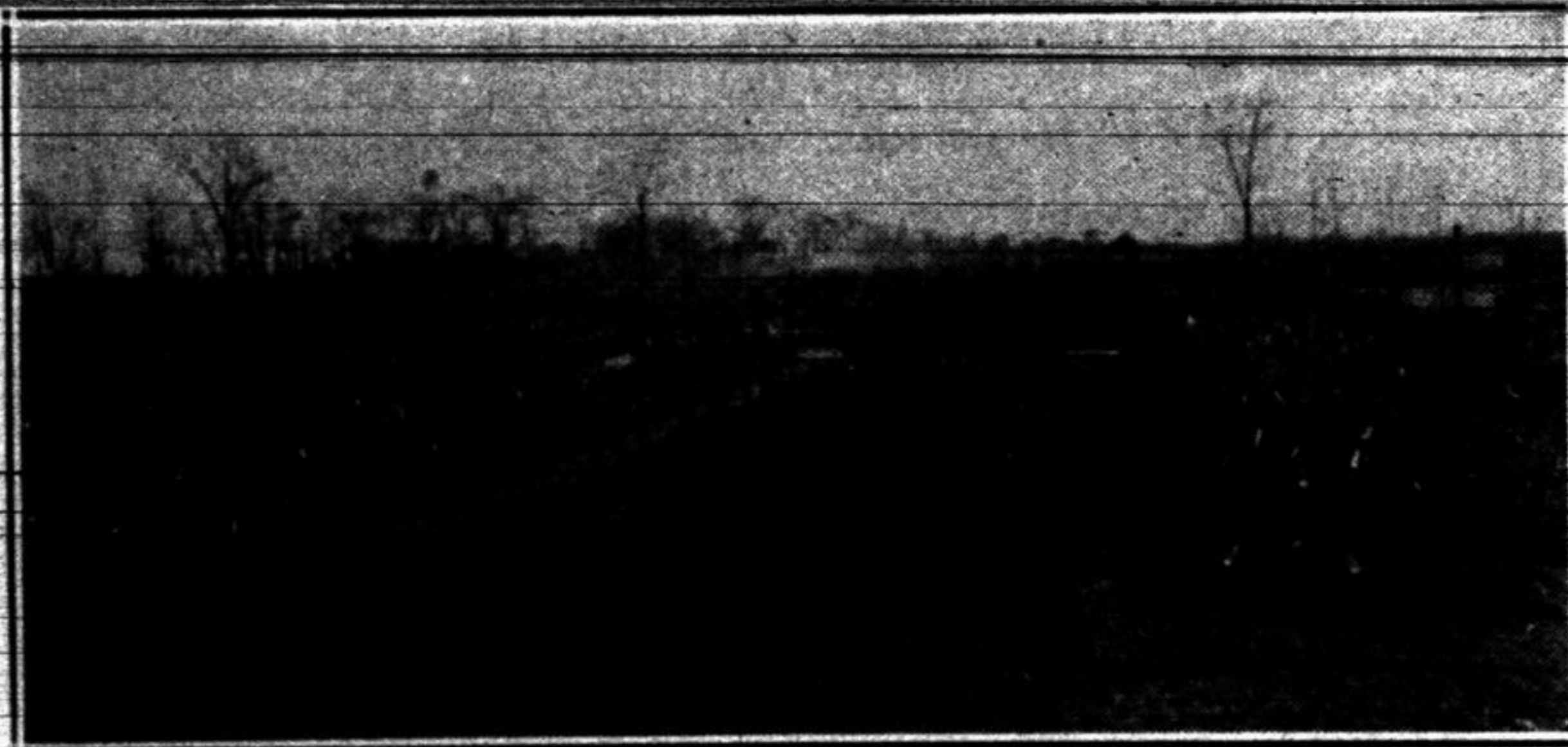

Deerfield Garden Club Plants Tree Honoring Washington

The Garden club of Deerfield met at the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad station on Wednesday, April 20 and started their program of beautifying the station grounds by planting an American Elm in commemoration of the Washington Bi-centennial celebration, Mrs. E. J. Ginter reading the poem "Trees" by Joyce Kilmer.

The tree planting in the honored memory of George Washington our first President was a most appropriate start and should be an inspiration in carrying out the actual work around the station which all fell will add materially to the appearance of the site.

Three months have been spent in the paper development of plan and

design. The committee have been fortunate in having the benefit of much experienced advise and a model has been prepared to submit to the proper railroad officials for approval. Their liberal cooperation has been promised and a strong desire manifested to meet the Garden club more than half way in this work.

The idea in itself is unique and a credit to Deerfield as it embodies both civic pride and the desire to assist the railroad management to beautify and better their property by helping on the financing end of the program as well as in its development.

After the ceremony of the tree planting the balance of the afternoon was enjoyed by all at the home of Mrs. Hawes on Brierhill road, Mrs. W. Aitken acting as assistant hostess with Mrs. E. B. Jordan and Mrs. L. E. Ashman pouring.

Stanton Is Elected Chairman By Lake County Supervisors

Supervisor Frank T. Stanton of Ingleside, long an influential member of the county board, Wednesday was chosen as unanimous choice for the chairmanship. He succeeded Supervisor William J. Obee of Highland Park.

Assistant Supervisor William E. Miller of Libertyville placed the name of Stanton in nomination, and Assistant Supervisor Charles O. Jones, Waukegan, seconded by Assistant Supervisor A. J. Sutkus, Waukegan, nominated Supervisor Charles J. Herschberger of Prairie View, says the News-Sun.

Herschberger, asking recognition from the chair, killed the boom for his candidacy with considerable brevity.

"I don't wish to be a candidate," he said, and then after a pause, "at this time."

Assistant Supervisor Thomas V. Murphy, North Chicago, then put the motion for an unanimous election of Stanton as chairman.

Stanton talked but briefly before taking the gavel from Obee to continue with the session.
