more that this community has had the benefit of the best effort available in its various activities and we join with all citizens in appreciating what has been accomplished by our public officials.

In times of prosperity, we are anxious to have the best the market affords and the resulting cost is often lost sight of. However, in times such as we are now experiencing, when all of those who must provide the funds to pay for public services have suffered increasingly as to finances, it is the thought of our Board of Trustees that radical changes should be made so that operating expenses may be greatly reduced.

Undoubtedly, the members of your board have been giving serious thought to the matter of reducing costs and it is our thought that those who are to pay whatever costs you establish in making up your budget should be given an opportunity to know just what steps you have taken in this connection. We would, therefore, ask that you furnish us with this information including a detailed list of the salaries paid during the past year as well as those proposed for the coming fiscal year, stating the name of each employee, the service performed and the amount of salary in each instance.

Relative to salaries, we might say that many have expressed the thought that the incomes of public employees have, in most cases, not suffered any reduction up to the first of this year, while the incomes of those who must provide the money for paying such salaries have been tremendously reduced. Under the circumstances, it is thought now to be only fair that the recipients of those salaries should be quite willing to share the misfortunes of their employers without a reduction of the service rendered.

In conclusion, we request that you defer final action on your budget un-

til the public has had a chance to be informed as to its details.
