Attempt to Depose City Manager Form at Kenosha Fails

The fourth attempt within ten years to depose the city manager form of municipal government in Kenosha in favor of the aldermanic system was unsuccessful last week as residents turned out more than 14,000 strong and decided by a vote of 8,449 to 5,914 to retain the present government.

Popularity of the city manager government in Kenosha was amply

demonstrated as the issue carried the election by more than 2,500 votes.

The referendum was held in conjunction with the regular election of three city councilmen from the city at large.

George S. Whyte, president of the council and a brother of Alderman John S. Whyte, of the Waukegan fourth ward, was re-elected. He polled 7,043 for the second highest vote of all candidates.

He was led in the voting by Jasper Gentile, prominent Kenosha business man who polled 7,613 votes.

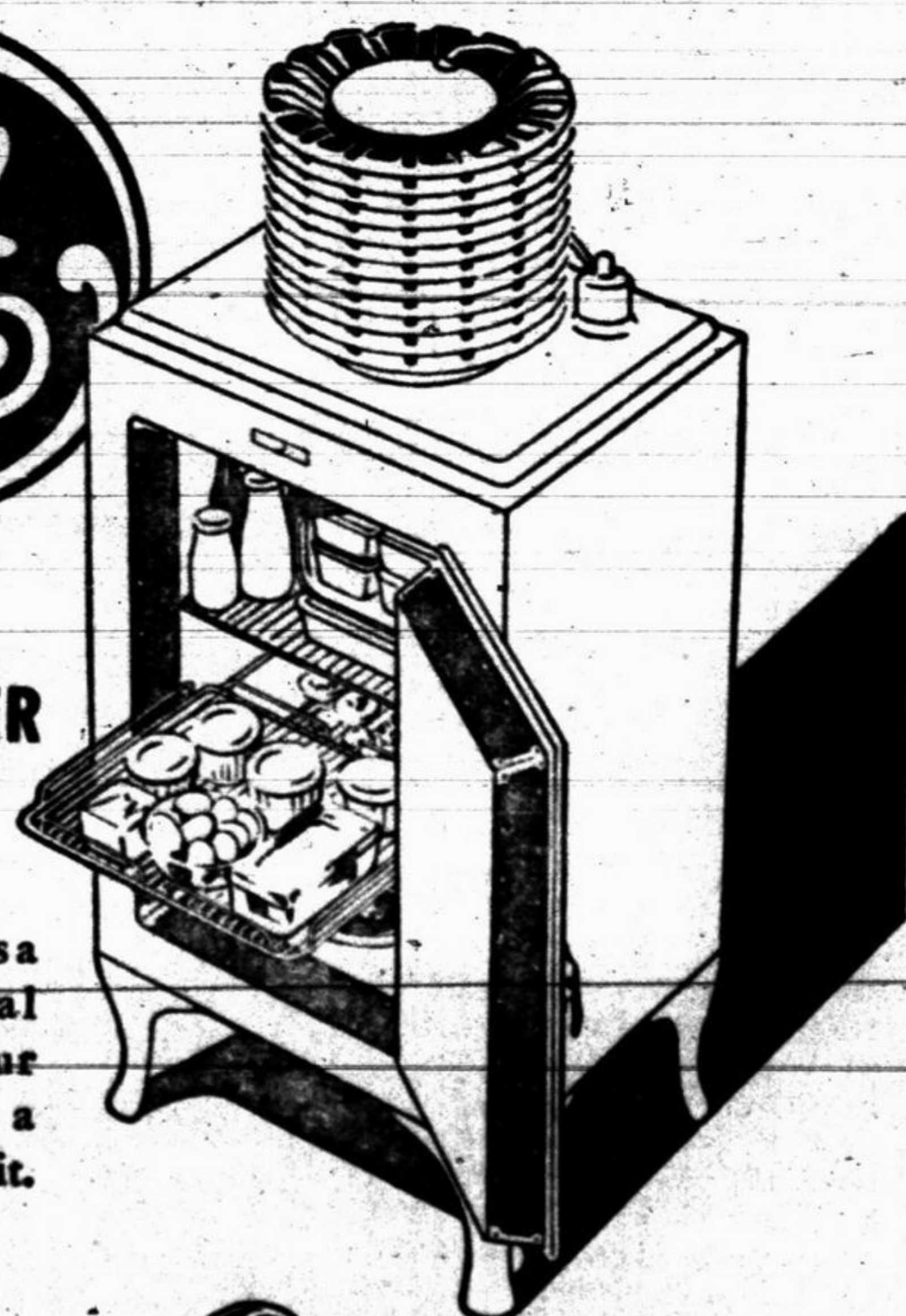
