mation of this kind until it is offi-  
cial public information. However,  
we will be glad to have you call at  
the City Hall and any of our records  
are open for inspection or the writer  
will be glad to go over any of these  
matters personally.

This reply, together with an in-  
terview had with the Mayor, makes  
it quite clear that the city officials  
do not feel that it is possible to  
effect any economies other than  
those resulting from a reduction in  
salary rates as detailed in the Sal-  
ary Appropriation Ordinance finally  
adopted by the Council at the meet-  
ing of Monday, May 2nd. It had  
been the hope of the officials of the  
City club that the passage of this  
ordinance could be deferred until  
such time as the tax payers might  
have an opportunity to consider con-  
templated readjustment of salaries  
and other economy measures.

The action of the City Council in  
passing the Salary Ordinance with-  
out delay seems to be conclusive  
evidence that the members of that  
body are satisfied that no further  
reductions in salaries can be ex-  
pected for the current year. It was  
also reported to the City club trust-  
ees that the City Council does not  
expect that its tax rate for this  
year can be reduced in any way.

#### School District Consolidation

A motion was proposed and car-  
ried authorizing the appointment of  
a committee to investigate the pos-  
sibility of consolidating all of our  
school districts into one so that in-  
stead of having three separate su-  
perintendents of schools with corre-  
sponding duplication of subordinate  
officers and other overhead charges,  
we might operate with one superin-  
tendent of schools so that there  
might be a general reduction in  
overhead charges for the operation  
of our school system. The commit-  
tee appointed for this investigation  
consists of Mr. Franklin E. Vaughn  
and Mr. Gerritt T. Thorne, both of  
these gentlemen being attorneys  
well qualified to serve in that ca-  
pacity.

#### Nominating Committee Appointed

A committee of five was appointed  
to nominate club officers for the  
new fiscal year as well as four trust-  
ees whose terms are expiring. When  
these nominations are ready notice  
will be given to club members of a  
members meeting and dinner to be  
held sometime during this month
