Fred Gallagher reported for his committee on entertainment of veterans, telling of the two entertainments given at the Veterans Bureau hospital 105 at North Chicago recently and reading a letter from that post expressing gratitude for the kindness bestowed. It was moved that letters of thanks be written to all who aided in the entertainment.

Albert Larson of the committee named to discuss with Chief of Police Moroney the matter of parking violations on North St. Johns avenue and on North Sheridan road, between Central and Park avenues, stated that the committee found the chief very sympathetic and that he had promised to co-operate by taking measures to alleviate the condition causing the complaint.

Moran Makes Report

Howard Moran, representative of the Chamber on the City Advisory committee, composed of representatives of local organizations as a liason group between taxpayers and local taxing bodies, reported regarding the matter of zoning restrictions. The report was referred to the board of directors of the Chamber which will report findings at the June meeting.

A communication was received from the Dayton, O., Chamber of Commerce urging the Chamber to oppose certain legislation in congress to prohibit the post office department from supplying stamped envelopes bearing printed return addresses of the senders. A motion was carried authorizing the sending of letters to congressmen and senators opposing such legislation.

Train Schedule

There was considerable discussion over the fact that Train No. 109 on the Chicago & Northwestern railroad, which leaves Chicago at 4:00 p.m. daylight time, does not make a stop in Highland Park, and a communication to the railroad company was authorized urging that the time card be altered to permit this train to stop in this city.
