BICYCLE AND SKATE EVENTS MAY 21ST

Bikes and Roller Skating to Be Featured; Meet Sponsored by Com. Service

Community Service has planned an especially interesting celebration for Saturday afternoon, May 21, when bicycle and roller skating events will be combined in one big meet. This will be on a roped-off street area very close to the business part of town and will be amply protected and supervised, so that large crowds of spectators may be ac- commodated without interfering with the numerous races and other events.

Cicycle Events

Bicycle events will include: Straight dashes of various lengths.

Post races—1 bicycle and 4 boys —each boy rides the bicycle 1 block and hands it to the next boy who returns it. This is practically a bicycle shuttle race.

Ride Run Ride—Ride a block, run and push bike one block, and mount and ride one block to finish.

Slow race—One block and see who comes in last, must keep going.

There will be a number of events for girls.

It has been possible to secure a number of very attractive prizes which will be offered to the winners in the various events. In addition to the events above prizes will be given for best decorated bicycles, for the best costumed riders, and for the most unusual costume or bike. This promises to give the event a Mardi Gras atmosphere.

Local merchants dealing in bi- cycles and roller skates are cooper- ating to make this celebration very attractive to all local residents.

Roller Skating

The roller skating, originally planned for May 14, will be run off during the afternoon too. The events for that will be as follows:

Straight race:

One-legged race — one skate on and carry other.

Three-legged race—tie two inside legs together and have the skates on outside legs.

Back race.

Relay races.

Double race—holding hands across the body.

Fours—race holding hands across the body.

High jump—start at 8 inches.

Obstacle race — skate to table, climb over, skate to tennis net, crawl

under, skate to bar 8 inches high, jump over, and skate to barrels, crawl through, and finish.

More complete details regarding this celebration and meet will be given in next week's paper.
