Joseph Zoul, aged thirty-four, passed away yesterday morning at the Waukegan hospital following a lingering illness. Funeral services will be held at nine-thirty Friday morning from the home of his sister Mrs. John Llewellyn, 121 Prairie avenue, to St. James church, Highwood. Interment will be in St. Mary's cemetery.

Mr. Zoul was born Nov. 14, 1898, and had lived in this city the greater part of his life. The past three years were spent in Albuquerque, N. Mex.

Besides his wife Margaret, he leaves a daughter Betty Ann, his mother Mrs. Antoinette Zoul, four sisters, Mrs. Block and Mrs. Chimera of Chicago, Mrs. Weidlich of Santa Barbara, Calif., and Mrs. John Zoul of Highwood, and three brothers, Ely of Villa Park, and Anton and John of Highwood, to survive him.

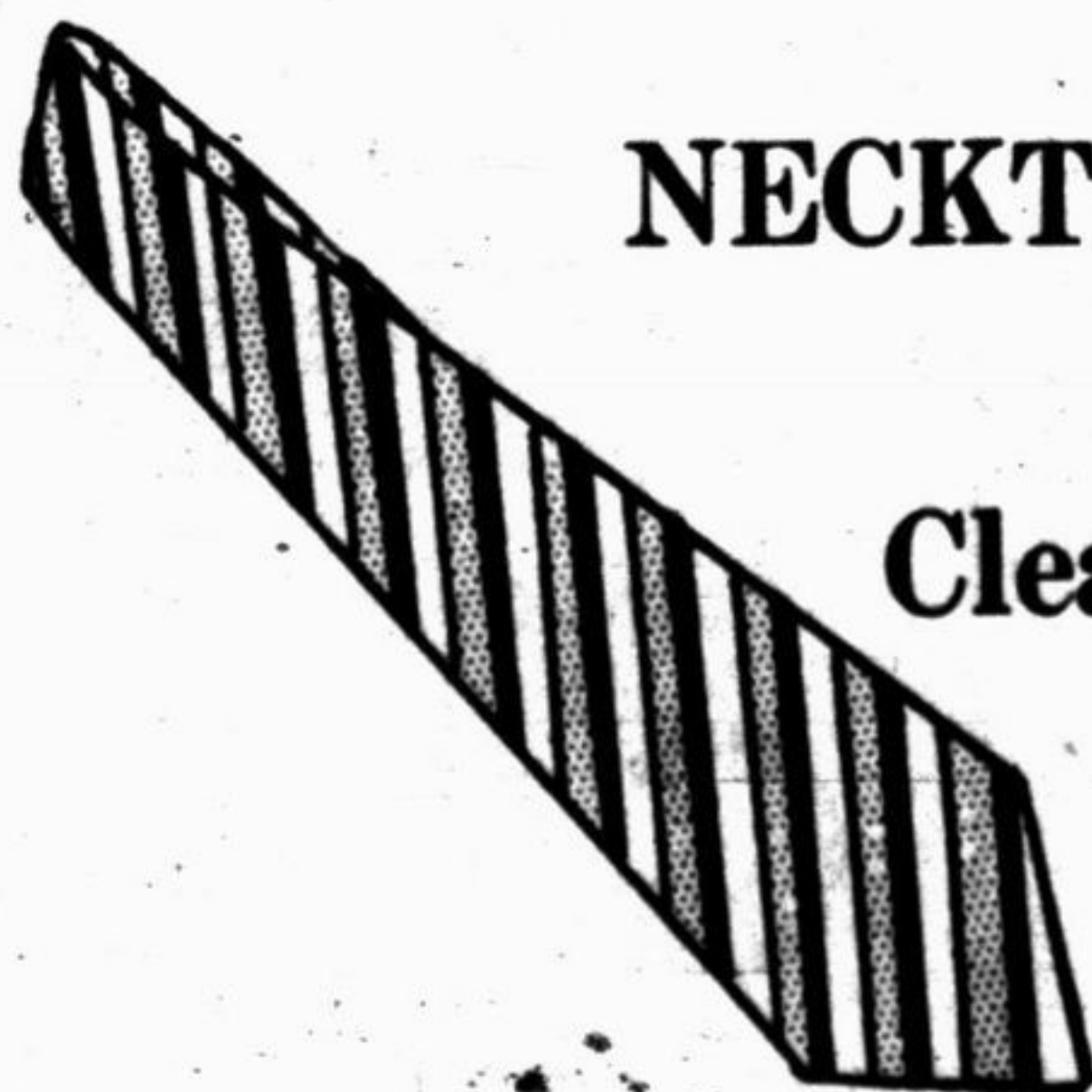
