

County Schools Get Share of State Fund; Petty Sends Out Cash

County schools in the rural and village division last week were sent a proportionate share of \$39,060 as their part of the state distributive school fund.

The checks were sent out by W. C. Petty, county school superintendent. There remains an amount of approximately \$63,000 still due from the state from the distributive fund. When this will arrive is problematical as Cook county work has been delayed considerably.

The total to be received is \$102,060 which is considerably higher than last year when \$92,000 was received.

Some of the money disbursed to the schools by Petty last year still is tied up in closed banks as there was an instance in which one treasurer carried the check for ten days without converting it into cash. When it was deposited it was too late to clear the bank.

County Treasurer Is Collecting Special Assessment Taxes

Collection of \$2,700,000 in special assessments throughout all the cities and villages of the county last week was started by County Treasurer Jay B. Morse.

The specials to be collected as the amounts owed for public improvements through the municipalities of the county on which city and village treasurers were unable to make collections.

No bills will be prepared for the City of Waukegan as these were sent out January 1 and no further notice is needed, although the law does not provide for any notice at all.

Of the delinquent specials close to \$1,000,000 are from Waukegan, while the second biggest sum comes from Highland Park.

The penalty date on specials started Jan. 1 when the interest for the new year became effective.

The treasurer is preparing to distribute approximately 20 per cent of the general taxes to the taxing bodies as that is close to the percentage collected.

Things To Cook

With the approach of spring we usually begin to think of the various foods which we may prepare in our automatic refrigerator. Among the desserts, I am sure you will appreciate this recipe for Maple Frango, which is a frozen dessert and does not require any attention after it is prepared and placed in the freezing tray of your refrigerator.

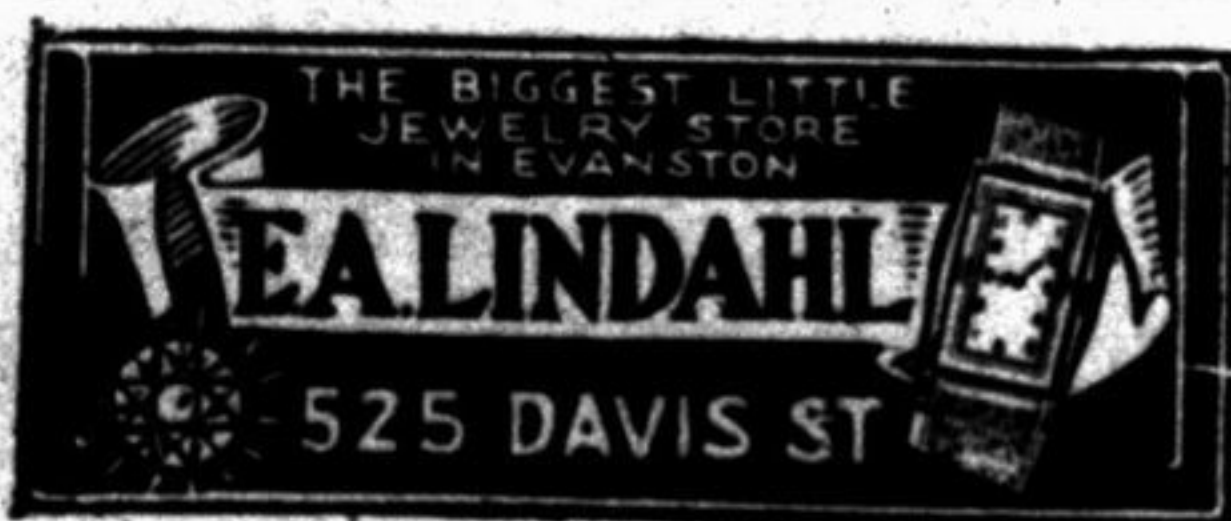
Maple Frango

- 1/2 cup maple syrup
- 2 egg yolks
- 1 teaspoon gelatine
- 1 tablespoon cold water
- 1/2 pint whipping cream (one cup)
- A few grains of salt.

Heat syrup in double boiler, pour onto beaten egg yolks and stir until well mixed. Return to double boiler and cook three minutes. Take from fire, add salt and the gelatine which has been soaked five minutes in the one tablespoon cold water. Stir over cold water until cold.

When cold, beat and add to the whipped cream, beating well together. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites last. Place in freezing unit of refrigerator and leave until frozen.

This makes one quart. Does not require stirring.
