SCOUTMASTER'S KEY**

**First Time This Honor Has
Been Given on North Shore;

These outstanding accomplishments is to be commended. Many other leaders are working towards this scoutmaster's key and hope to share the honors with Mr. Roeber in the near future. Mr. Roeber's accomplishments represent a splendid contribution to the boyhood of the north shore.
