Alcyon Theatre Has New Cooling System in Operation Friday

The new cooling and ventilating system at the Alcyon is now practically ready for operation and will be in operation by this Friday night, June 24, at the latest. This plant is the newest type washed-air conditioning system. The outside air is drawn into the theatre through a huge washer, consisting of hundreds of streams of water under terrific pressure, and thus cleansed and cooled. Under the new system there is a complete change of air in the theatre auditorium every two minutes, as during that time 90,000 cubic feet of air is blown in.
