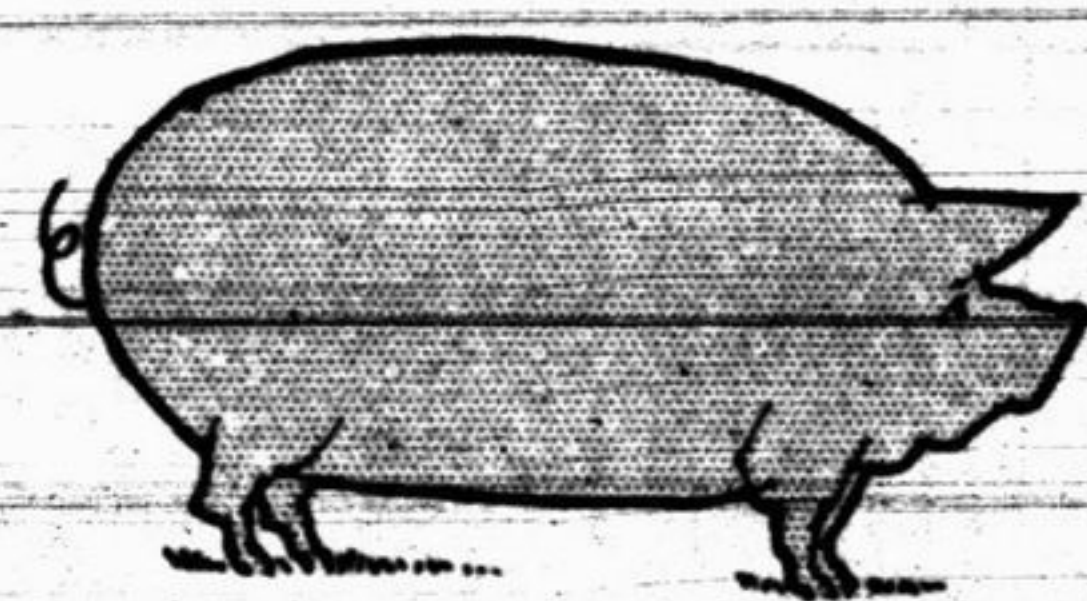

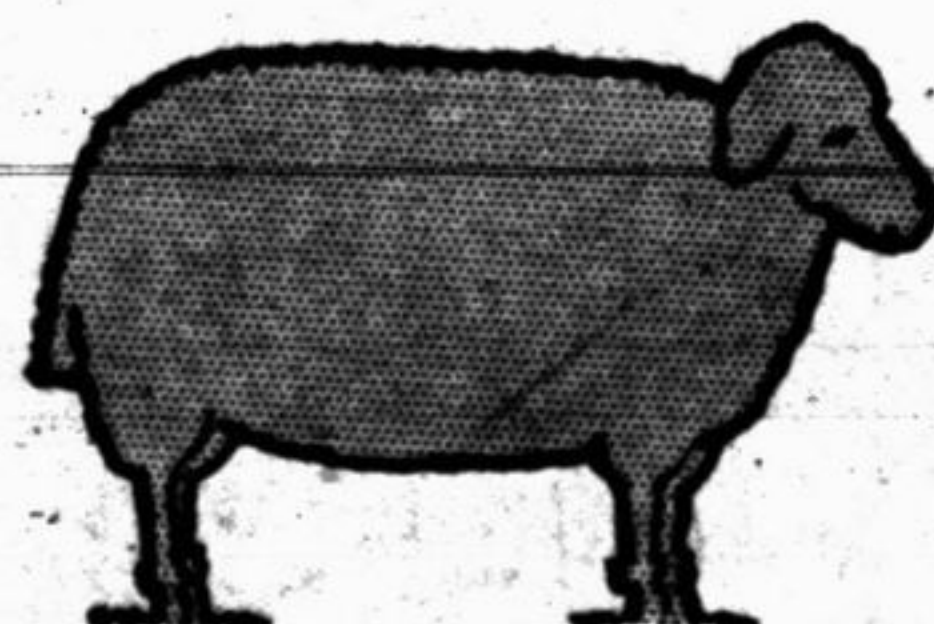

TWO CHILDREN ARE DROWNED IN COUNTY

One in Cistern; Other in Lake, Accidents Occur Within Hour Is Report

Two children, one three years old and the other eight, were drowned within an hour apart last week to raise Lake county's drowning toll for the season to a total of three. One child lost his life in a cistern and the other drowned while wading along the Zion beach with a younger brother who was rescued. David Green, 3, one of 9 children in the family of Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Green of Loon Lake, fell into a cistern under the back porch of the farm home owned by Morley Webb near Antioch.

Sees Body in Well

The mother had raised the cover of the cistern to dip up a pail of water for use in the kitchen. She carried the water there and returned to the opening to shut down the cover when she saw the child's body at the bottom of the 12 foot cistern, in three feet of water. Her screams attracted some of her other children and the eldest ran for the father who was working at the Oakland school, a mile away.

Green arrived on the run, dropped down into the cistern and lifted the child to the mother above. The Antioch fire department and Dr. Roy Williams were notified at once. The firemen, before leaving for the Green home, summoned Robert Burleigh, from the Fox Lake fire department who is employed by the Public Service company and is one of their crack first aid men. Burleigh and two companions, assisted by members of the Antioch department, worked over the child for two and one-half hours before Dr. Williams pronounced him dead.

Boy Drowns, Brother Saved

August St. Jermain, Jr., 8, of 3005 Elim avenue, Zion, was drowned at the Zion bathing beach near the rows of summer cottages near 29th street.

If a 14-year-old youngster, Joseph Metzler, had not acted promptly it would have been a double tragedy as Metzler was able to save the life of Richard Jermain, 6, a brother of the child who drowned.
