BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, County of Lake and State of Illinois.

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF PARK OFFICERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1932, AND ENDING MAY 31, 1933.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT:

SECTION 1.—That the salaries of the following Park officers for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1932, and ending May 31, 1933, be fixed at such sum as is provided for by this ordinance for such officers for the discharge of the duties of such offices as required under the laws of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the Highland Park East Park District during the term of his office, and that such officers shall receive no further compensation from the Highland Park East Park District for the duties of such office during the term thereof. That the salary of the Secretary of the Highland Park East Park District is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00).

That the salary of the Superintendent of Parks of the Highland Park East Park District is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00). That the salary of the Treasurer of the Highland Park East Park District be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Fifty Dollars, (\$50.00).

That the salary of the Chief of Police of the Highland Park East Park District be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00).

That the salary of Professional and Greens Keeper of the Highland Park East Park District be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00).

SECTION 2.—That all other employees of the Highland Park East Park District shall receive such salaries or compensation per hour, per diem, per week or per month as may be fixed by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District or the officers or Committee having authority thereof.

SECTION 3.—The salaries provided for in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the first and fifteenth day of each month for the preceding half month of service during the term of office.

SECTION 4.—All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof are and each of them is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 5.—This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
