

Waukegan Paper Says Assistant Supervisors Involved May Refuse to Quit

According to the Waukegan News-Sun the board of supervisors may not lose ten assistant supervisors, as planned in a resolution adopted by the board at its session last week to conform with a new law providing for the curtailment of county boards according to population. The Waukegan paper says that Waukegan, Deerfield and Shields assistants affected will decline to withdraw. The law in question provides that the assistants involved may decide who shall retire by drawing lots, and the report from Waukegan states that the assistants in the three townships named are not planning to draw any lots. As the act does not make any provision to force such drawing at least five of the ten assistants supposed to be affected may continue on the board, the report indicates. The News-Sun report, in part is as follows:

Ten Assistants Affected

In Lake county the new law calls for a reduction of ten assistant supervisors. It provided that Waukegan would lose seven, Deerfield two and Shields one.

All of that worked out in an orderly fashion and the county board of supervisors at a session Tuesday took cognizance of the fact and by resolution notified the town boards of the law. Provision was made for Assistant Supervisors Charles Harbaugh, William E. Bletsch, and William Witten, all Highland Park men, to draw for the one post in Deerfield. The resignation of Paul Udell there removed one man from the lottery for a seat on the board.

In Shields it was provided that Assistant Supervisors Charles Fitzgerald and Edward M. Mawman draw for the one place, Mawman lived in Lake Bluff and Fitzgerald in Lake Forest.

Waukegan now has 15 assistants on the board, and the change could cut this to eight, with four hold-overs to 1935 in the persons of Frank Burke, Ira Holdridge, Tony Sutkus and Walter Piquette.

Waukegan Situation Four were elected for short terms,


Walter H. Diesner, Einar Mohberg, Jack Hoban and Richard Brenton. Brenton and Hoban resigned and Diesner and Mohberg automatically retire at the end of their terms in the spring.

This leaves seven men, Percy Gustafson, Emmett McShane, Charles Selenak, Charles O. Jones, Al Ratajezak, August Cepon and Thomas Baron to draw lots for the four seats to be filled.

In Deerfield, Witten will not take part in drawing because he was elected to office until 1935.

Fitzgerald refuses to draw in Shields, but there is no difficulty there as Mawman is too occupied with business to serve longer and stands ready to resign.

In Waukegan none will draw.
