Indians Win Two; Beat Mundelein 4-1 for 4th Straight Win

Increasing their winning streak to four straight, the Highwood Indians baseball team defeated Wilmette and Mundelein by scores of 10-6 and 4-1 respectively. Maestri was the winning pitcher against Wilmette while Artis held Mundelein to five hits to win this game.

Indians vs. Wilmette

After playing a close game and taking turns in making runs, the Highwood Indians finally nosed out the Wilmette Pioneers by a score of 10-6. Although the Pioneers were never out in front they kept on tying the score until the Indians finally got ahead by scoring three runs in the fifth and another in the sixth.

The Indians scored at least one run in every inning and scored three in both the first and fifth innings. The Pioneers were scoreless until the third when they scored three runs. They scored two more in the next inning and their last in the fifth inning.

After the Indians had used two pitchers Maestri was put in as a relief pitcher for Castellari. While he was holding the Pioneers down, Taylor, O'Conner and Artis were smacking the ball around to help score the Indians' runs. Artis pulled the Indians out of a tie when he hit the first home run of the

year for the Indians with two men on.

Indians vs. Mundelein

In the game against Mundelein Artis was the main attraction. He allowed only five hits and struck out nine men to win the game by a score of 4-1. Taylor, Maestri, Anderson, and Castellani did most of the hitting for the Indians with two hits apiece.

After a hit by Taylor and a stolen base, the Indians scored one run in the first inning on a hit by Maestri. The score remained one to nothing until the fifth inning. In this inning Mundelein put up much trouble for Artis. A single and a double started things for Mundelein. After a strike out and a play on home plate produced two outs with men on first and third a clean single to center field looked like more trouble for Artis but a nice throw-in by center fielder Anderson to third base retired the side with a one to one tie.

In the seventh inning Castellani started an Indian rally with a clean out single. He scored, after an out, on Taylor's double who in turn scored on Maestri's single. Two strike out, however, retired the side.

The Indians scored one more run in the eighth inning and since Mundelein could do no better than a base on balls since the fifth inning the game ended four to one in the Indians' favor.

To Play Colored Stars

Playing one of the strongest teams in Lake county, the Highwood Indians will meet the Colored Stars of North Chicago on Monday the 4th of July. The Colored Stars will try to break the Indians winning streak and a close battle is anticipated. It is hoped that a large crowd will be at Highwood Field, on the 4th of July to witness this game.

In preparatory to this game, the Indians will play the Old Timers from Highwood at the Highwood field on Sunday, July 3. This game should prove to be an interesting game since all of Highwoods ex-stars will again show up on the baseball field. Ted Shannon will do the pitching for the Old Timers.

May Widen Waukegan Road to County Line

Further widening of Green Bay road (42-A) will be completed this summer it became evident last week to the county highway department, says the *Waukegan News-Sun*.

The survey is completed for a road of 40 feet in width between Everett and the Cook county line, a distance just short of five miles, and but one piece of property remains to be obtained for right-of-way.

Work is in progress now between Everett and Rockland road on widening, and if plans carry the work will be completed this fall from the Cook county line to the intersection with Rockland Road, just west of Lake Bluff, the highway department learned.

Many Telephone Lines Now Connect England and Continent, Report

During the past year, the one hundredth through telephone circuit connecting England and the continent of Europe was brought into use. At present, there are 108 of these circuits working.

Ten years ago the only channels of telephonic communication between England and the mainland of Europe comprised 23 circuits to Northern France and Belgium. Shortly thereafter the first Anglo-Dutch circuit was opened for service. Now, instead of being practically limited as formerly to communication with Brussels, Antwerp, Paris, Lille, Boulogne and Calais, with connections somewhat undependable with Marseilles and Switzerland, the British telephone subscriber can speak with practically every country in Europe, with the exception of some of the Balkan States. The majority of these countries are served by through circuits, while service to the more easterly ones is switched via exchanges in Germany, Austria and Hungary.

There are now 36 telephone circuits connecting England with France, 23 with Germany, 15 with Holland, 14 with Belgium, seven with Switzerland, three with Spain, three with Sweden, two with Italy, and one each with Austria, Hungary, Szecho-Slovakia, Denmark and Norway. Of the through circuits, 31 terminate in Paris, nine in Berlin, seven in Hamburg, nine in Amsterdam, and eight in Brussels.

Submarine cables between England and the continent are laid at the joint cost of the British Post Office and the foreign administrations concerned.
