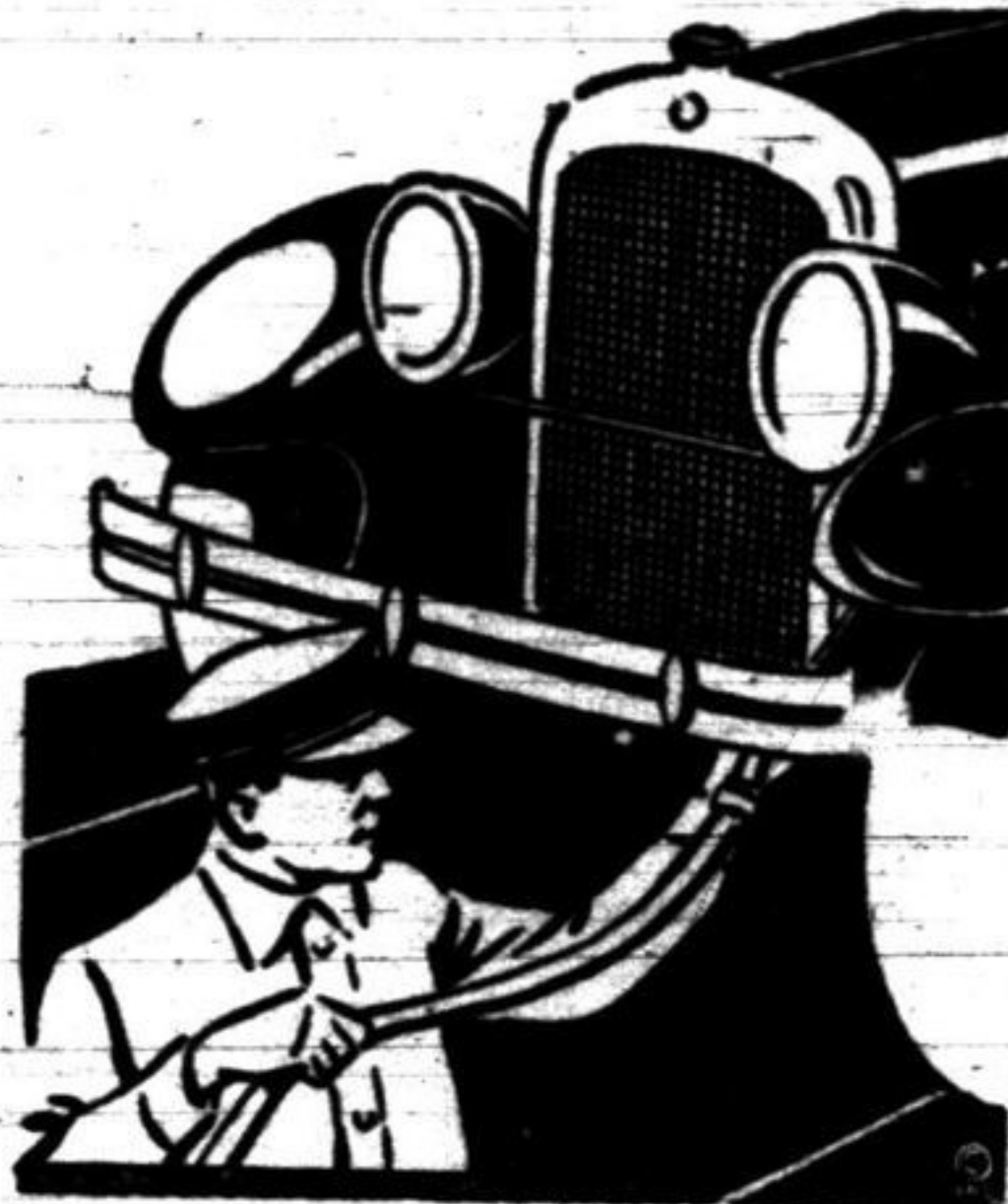

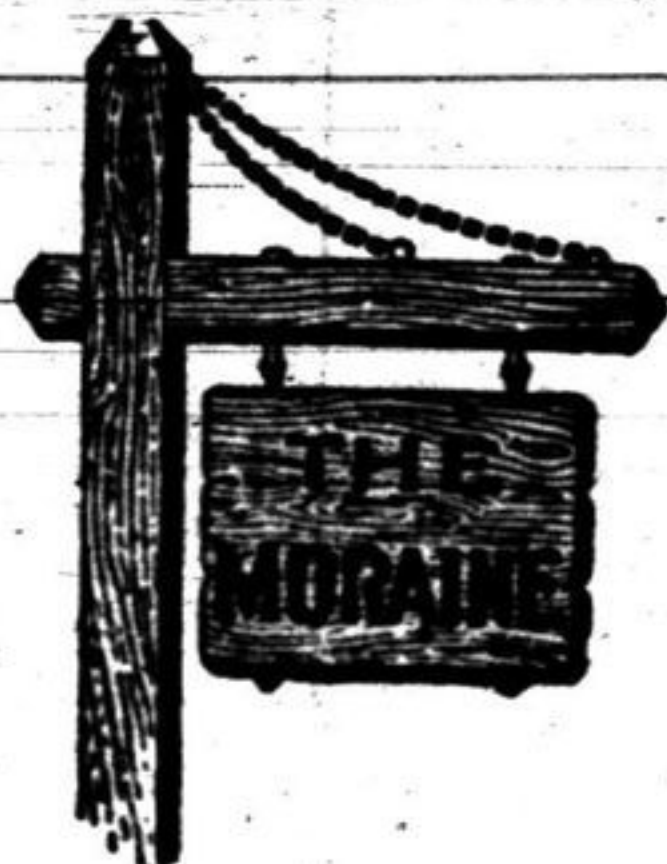

N. S. Sanitary District Now Planning Building at Winthrop Harbor

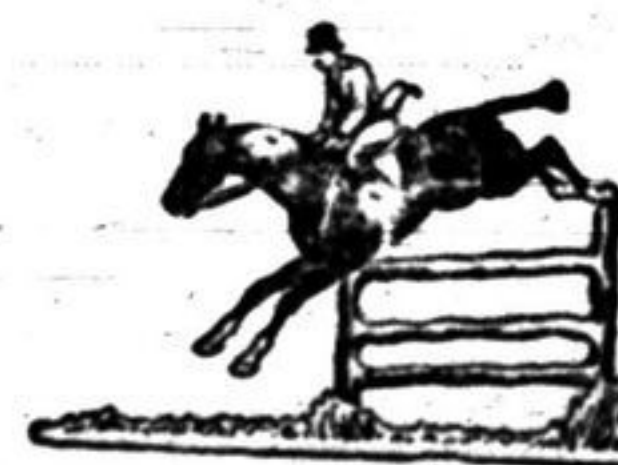
Having brought to completion the work on various sewage disposal plants in North Chicago, Zion, Lake Forest and Highland Park, the North Shore Sanitary District board is making arrangements for the state of work on Winthrop Harbor's plant early next spring. Plans and specifications will be drawn next winter and contracts let, so that work can start without delay when building weather arrives.

Winthrop Harbor's plant will be the fifth unit in the sanitary board's building program based on the \$1,200,000 bond issue that was approved on Dec. 20, 1930. Waukegan is the only city along the north shore that has not made some definite progress toward the construction of its plant although its sewage problem is greater than that of any other city in the district.

Under the direction of the sanitary board, engineers have made surveys at Winthrop Harbor. They have recommended a flat tract of land near the main east and west streets of the village, about half way between the North Western railroad tracks and the lake. It is possible that condemnation proceedings may be instituted in order to secure the land if an agreement is not reached in any other way.

Winthrop Harbor's plant will cost about \$30,000, according to present estimates. An additional expense of \$4,000 will be necessary on the village's part to construct a sewer from the present outlet to the plant.

Preparations for Lake County's agricultural fair, which is to be held at Antioch on October 6, 7, and 8, have begun and the Ninth Annual Exhibition promises to be a greater attraction than heretofore.

Highland Park Fire Insurance Rates Are Cut by Underwriters

Reduction in Highland Park fire insurance rates became effective last week with announcement from the Illinois inspection bureau of the board of underwriters that the city's fire fighting equipment has been boosted two classifications to the No. 5 rating.

In the course of five years, the Highland Park fire department reached the new high rating as the last inspection was made in 1927 when a classification was announced.

Commissioner Robert Greenslade stated that the higher rating comes as a result of erection of a south side fire station at Ravinia, the standardization of all fire hydrants and general increasing of the department's efficiency.

The insurance rate reduction, Greenslade said, is a good example of the value of increased fire protection and the savings to policy holders will more than offset the money spent on maintaining the department.

In the report including the new classification the state inspection bureau also included several proposals for further improvements that will enable the department to reach a still higher rating.

Additional mains are recommended for some sections and it is suggested that a member of the water department attend all fires that all alarms be sent to the waterworks, a new 600 gallon per minute pumper, a drill tower for department men, and the addition of four to seven men at the central station and four at the Ravinia station.

Rail-Lake Trip Is Arranged by North Shore Line Chgo.-Milwaukee

A new type of holiday trip—a combined rail and lake outing at bargain rates—is the latest travel innovation offered local residents by the North Shore line in conjunction with the Great Lakes Transit Corporation. Known as the circle tour, this trip affords all the advantages of longer, more expensive land and water trips, providing an enjoyable one-day or overnight outing at economy prices. The tour is being operated once each week, starting on Friday, and will continue to and including August 26.

"The circle tour was established to meet the present-day demand for economical outings," said W. O. Eubanks, agent at Highland Park.

The tour may be started from any point on the North Shore line, connections with the steamer being made at either Milwaukee or Chicago. The steamer leaves Chicago northbound at 11 p.m., and southbound, Milwaukee at 9:30 a.m. (Standard Time) every Friday. The fare covers all accommodations.
