SUPER-HIGHWAY PLAN HEAR NEARS SUCCESS

Most of Right of Way Through Skokie in This City Is Secured Is Report

With the exceptions of easements through four pieces of property right of way for the Skokie superhighway through Highland Park has been secured, it was reported by Acting Mayor Lyle Gourley, at a meeting of the city council last

Thursday evening.

One of the difficult problems confronting the city in its effort to obtain a route through the city for this boulevard is arranging for right of way through the Northmoor club, as the road would take a 100-foot strip off its golf course. However, it is believed that negotiations in this direction will be successfully concluded, it was explained. It may be a month or more before a final report on the right of way through the city will be available, it was predicted.

Seek 100 Feet

A 100-foot right-of-way has been secured through most of the Highland Park sector by the city council, and, for a time, it was anticipated that easements for the roadway would all have been secured by the time of the council meeting last night.

Ordinances were presented at the city council meeting last night proposing revisions of the building code which will permit property owners along the proposed new roadway to erect business buildings if they desire.

Through Skokie

The Skokie roadway will follow the Skokie Valley branch of the North Shore line railroad through Highland Park and an entire new roadway must be secured through an area now occupied by subdivisions, estates and golf courses.

Several of the owners giving land for the right-of-way wanted the right to erect business buildings if they deemed it desirable to do so.

The proposed amendments to the building and zoning ordinances will be acted on at the next meeting of the city council. No meeting was held Monday evening of this week.

The Skokie roadway, a state project in both Illinois and Wisconsin, will eventually provide a 100-foot roadway from Chicago to Milwau-
