**AMERICAN ARTISTS
 PAINT HOME SCENES**

More and More Turning to American Subjects for Their Landscapes

A foreigner walked through the galleries of the Art institute of Chicago the other day and on seeing a number of canvases, evidently of European landscapes, or portraits of European notables, remarked, "Why don't American artists paint more of their own landscapes and of their own people? You have everything in America that an artist could wish for!"

The answer is that they have been doing this of late years to a degree that is bringing the American scene more and more into prominence. A timely exhibition, showing the work of representative American artists for the past 150 years, has just been opened at the Art institute, to be continued throughout the Summer, or until October 9. Thirty-one painters are represented with an equal number of canvases. Of these important paintings, all of which are of museum quality, only seven are of foreign subjects. John Singleton Copley, one of our most brilliant early Americans, born in 1737 and who lived most of his life in London, where he died in 1815, is the author of the full length portrait of Brass Crosby, Lord Mayor of London.

Alaskan Scene
 Rockwell Kent, one of the most vigorous, original and modern contemporary painters left the United States to paint a picture that he had long visioned, but he journeyed to an American possession to paint it—the far northerland of Alaska. "Alaska" is the title of his painting, now on exhibition, and it contains

in its cold color and massive design practically the whole story of this mysterious country.

Maurice Sterne has given us a scene in the island of Bali, off the coast of Java. He calls it "Two Girls Going to Market." It shows the brown-skinned maids, one close behind the other, walking in their slow undulating strides, one with a large bowl poised on her head. It is a small canvas, painted with a dark brown and dark green-gray palette, but filled with the spirit of indolent life in the hot tropics. John Singer Sargent has portrayed Mrs. Dyer, wife of John Gifford Dyer, in one of the really great inspirational moments of his career. It was painted in Venice in 1880.

English Type
 Everett Shinn's splendid canvas of the "London Hippodrome" is a typical English scene observed through the eyes of an American, alive to the dramatic values of color at night. "The Toning of the Bell" by Walter Shirlaw, is also typical of a scene.

Scenes From Ministry of Jesus in Prints From Old Masters

Many scenes from the three years' ministry of Jesus is to be found in the exhibition of prints from the Old Masters, now on view in Room 18, of the Print Galleries in the Art institute of Chicago. Many of them are extremely naive in their drawing, for the craftsmen of the days of van Leyden and Schoengauer used their own townsmen for models, even dressing them in the costumes of the day. In Schoengauer's creation of Pilate washing his hands of responsibility for the condemnation of Jesus, we see Pilate with a typical Van Dyck beard, full, curly locks and a high, fanciful, peaked Dutch hat. This is in direct variance with the conception of the Hungarian, Munkacsy, who, however, came three centuries later, but who conceived Pilate as smooth shaven square headed, with scant hair and dressed in simple Roman toga. Van Meckenen's engraving of Christ washing the feet of his disciples, is equally naive. They are however, extremely interesting because of the sincerity of their craftsmanship.
