Class 8, 5:00—Polo pony—Open to all; performance 60%, conformation 40%; to be shown with mallet as directed by the judge.

Class 9, 5:20—1st Heat Hunter Sweepstake—Open to all over Olym- pic course; performance only to count; ribbon winners to show in finals Sunday.

Class 1, 2:30—Ladies' Hunters— To be ridden by ladies; performance and manners 50%, conformation 50%.
