Competitive drills by the Infantry, Cavalry, and Field Artillery and driving contests and maneuvers will compete the all military show to be given each evening.

The equestrian events, open to civilian and military entries, begin Friday afternoon at 2:30, when the afternoon classes will include pair jumping, novice hunters, triple bar jumpers, three gaited saddle horse, middle and heavyweight hunter, polo pony, and the first heat of the Hunter sweepstake over the difficult Olympic course.

Saturday, morning, from 9:30 to 12:00, the Children's Horse show, conducted under the supervision of Miss Libby Chase, will be held.

The classes Saturday afternoon beginning at 2:30, will include ladies hunter, three gaited saddle horse, officers' charger (open to any citizen of the United States), five gaited saddle horse, lightweight hunter, hunter hack, team of three hunters, touch and out, and the second heat of the Hunter sweepstake.

Sunday afternoon, Sept. 18, the grand championship contest in four main events will be held at the Fort Sheridan polo field. Beginning at 2:30 championships in the jumper, hunter, and hunter sweepstakes, will be shown, and a polo game for the Military championship of the Sixth Corps area, beginning at 3:15, will close the afternoon features. finals in the military firing events will be held Sunday evening to conclude the show.

57 Post Grads and Special Students Entered at D.S.H.S.

Fifty-seven post-graduate and special students are attending classes at the Deerfield-Shields high school this year, taking from two to four courses each. This is a material increase over last year and all previous years.

Of this number, there is one member of the class of '29, one of the class of '30 and four of the class of '31. The remainder are members of the class of '32. Most of the students are graduates of Deerfield-Shields, but there are a few from other schools.

It was the hope of Mr. Sandwick, principal, that a special course in social science survey—a freshman course given at the University of Chicago—might be given to those post graduate students who were planning on going to college, but it was found that this would incur an expense which the school could not afford at this time. However, many of the courses given here will bear college credit in the various colleges throughout the country.

Many students in the past have found this to be the case, gaining credit in languages, mathematics, and English, where the student has completed the required credits first. Such courses as mechanical drawing are also given credit in some schools.

The present group of post-graduate students is taking courses in languages and the commercial subjects mostly, but there are a number in English and mathematics classes of advanced nature, and a number in the domestic science department and the vocational department.
