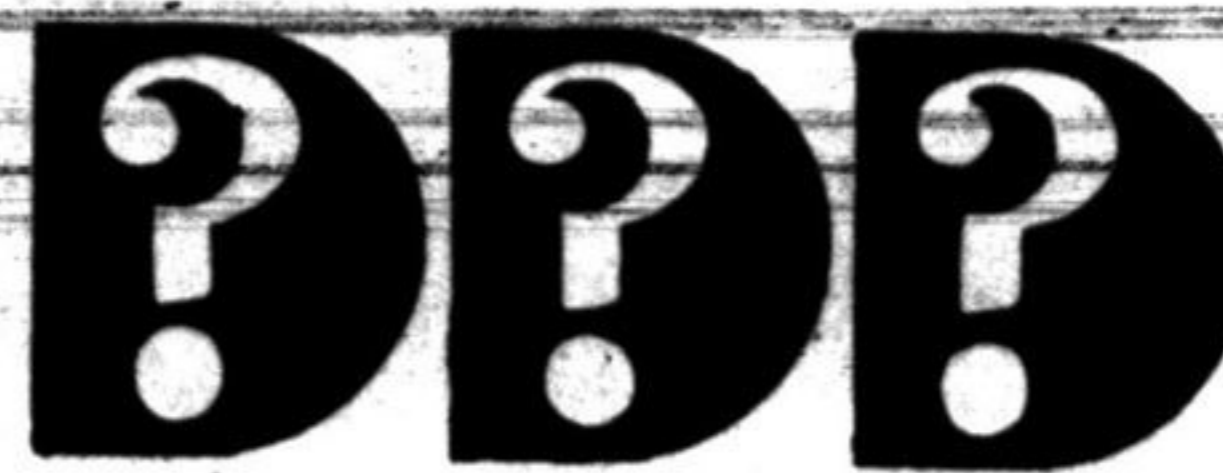

Strong Offense To Be Feature Of Wildcats' Game; Schedule Given

Efforts to replace last year's power attack with an offense built on speed will be undertaken by Coach Dick Hanley as he goes about the task of rebuilding Northwestern's football eleven for the 1932 campaign.

Loss by graduation of a quartet of 200 pound linemen, including Riley, Marvel, Engebretsen and Evans, has convinced the Wildcat coach that only by reconstructing an entirely new attack can the Purple cope with the heavy schedule confronting it this fall.

Spring practice proved sufficient to convince Coach Hanley that his departing linemen cannot be replaced defensively. Consequently, stress will be placed this fall on a speedy offense to make up for this loss of power. The Wildcats will adopt the military strategem that a strong offense is the best defense.

Although the Wildcats' backfield lost a number of good ball carriers in Russell, Meenan and Moore, they are still fortunate in having on hand such capable backs as Capt. Pug Rentner, Jackie Sullivan, George Potter and Ollie Olson. This group fits in with Hanley's idea of a fast, shifty backfield, and is just about the group that will form the first string backfield this fall. The Wildcats' schedule follows:
