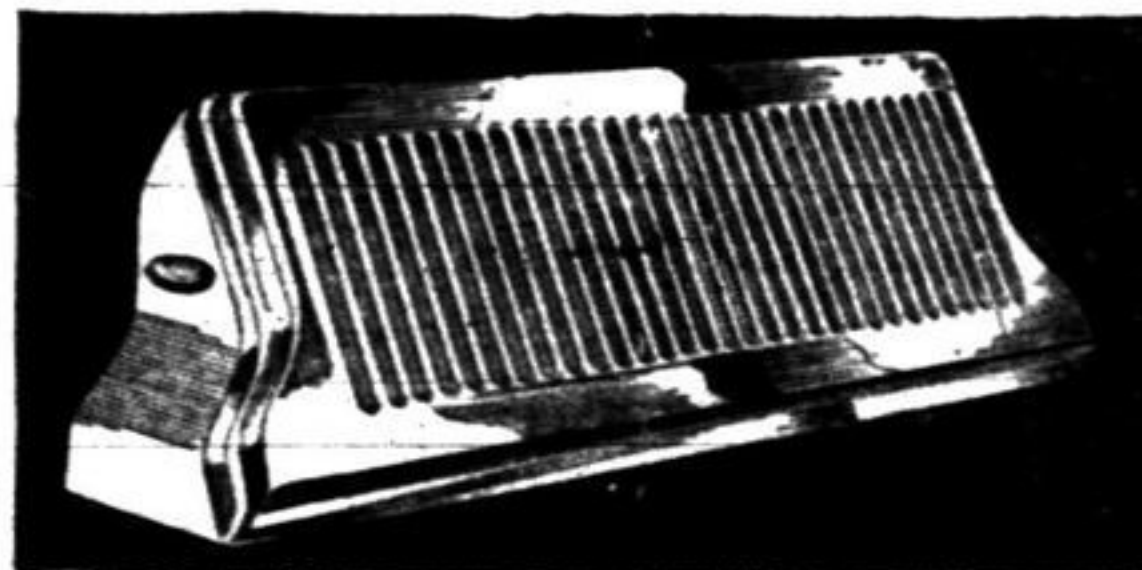
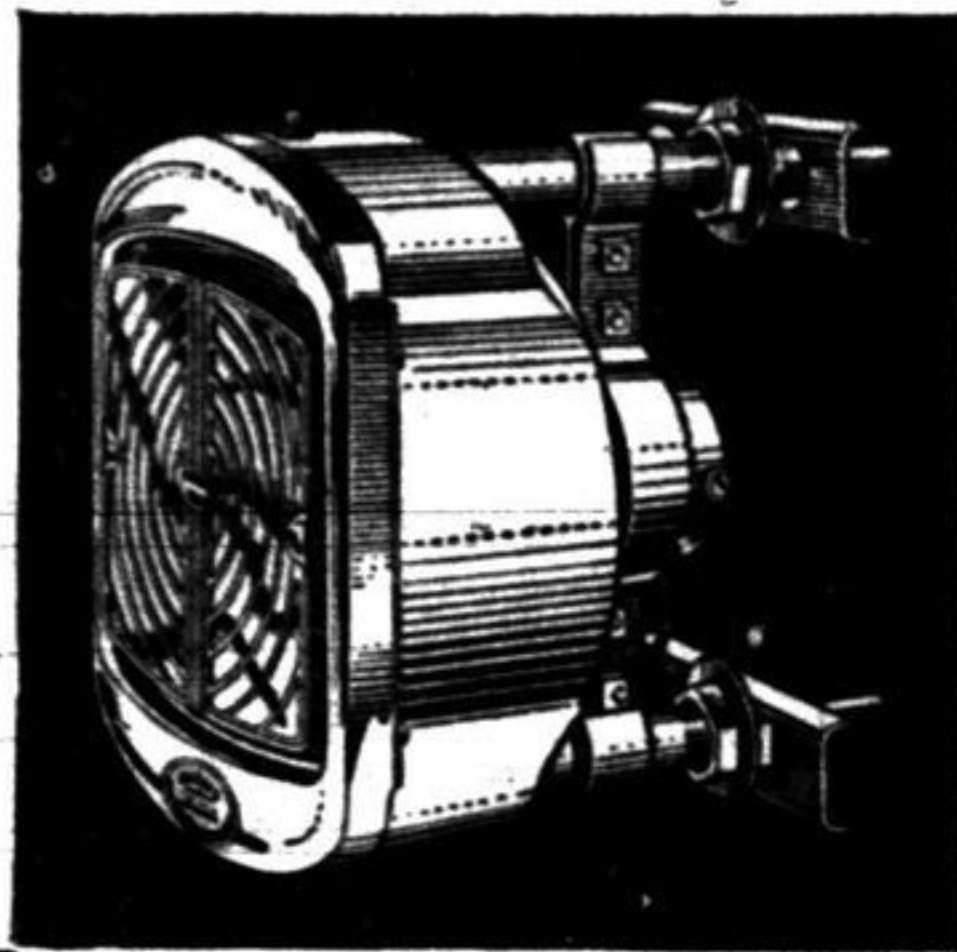

### Membership Week of Needlework Guild to Begin October 10th

National Membership Week of the Needlework Guild of America, one of the largest charitable organizations in the world, with branches in nearly 800 cities and towns throughout the United States, in Honolulu and in Panama, will begin October 10. During the week of the 10th to 15th, the annual collection of garments for the needy will begin, and new members will be cordially welcomed by officers of the various branches.

Last year, the guild, "The Charity that Helps all Charities," collected and distributed to hospitals, homes and institutions, 1,900,000 garments and pieces of household linen, increasing the number for the previous year by 100,000. This was accomplished with the aid of the Junior Workers, numbering 32,000, some of them children only five years of age, who collected 106,000 articles. They were assisted by the Boy Scouts, who proved enthusiastic and valuable workers.

The Needlework Guild of America which was founded in Philadelphia in 1885, by the late Mrs. John Wood

Stewart, was modeled upon a similar organization started in Dorsetshire, England, by Lady Wolverton.

Membership in the guild consists of giving two new garments a year and in view of the present urgent need, everyone is asked to join the guild and aid in supplementing the work of the hospitals, whose comfortable beds the outgoing patients must leave, often to return to cold, cheerless homes, with such scant, poor clothing that relapse or some other form of disease finds them an easy prey. The warm, serviceable clothing collected by the many branches of the guild this fall, will go to hundreds of institutions throughout the country, where it will be distributed to children, the aged and the friendless, in other words, the utterly helpless.

The president of the Highland Park branch is Mrs. Thomas Creigh; vice-president, Mrs. Sellar Bullard and Mrs. Rolland Hastings; secretary, Mrs. Edwin T. Johnson, Jr.

The beneficiaries of the Highland Park branch to which garments have been distributed during the past year, include: The Highland Park hospital, the Visiting Nurse, the Dorcas Home, the Lake Bluff Orphanage, the Ridge Farm Preventorium.
