

Painting and Quilt Exhibition Saturday

During the coming week end there is to be an exhibition by Alma S. Bigelow and Elizabeth Wells Robertson, to be held in Ravinia's art colony at the foot of Judson avenue and sponsored by Miss Luella Heinroth. At 1237 Judson avenue there will be a large collection of the handiwork of these two gifted Ravinians.

Miss Bigelow will show paintings and decorated trays, furniture and other articles. The many colorful flower canvases reveal the influence of her own charming garden, which has the distinction of being on the Chicago Tribune honor roll.

As head designer of interior decorations and furnishings and as a painter of special panels, including murals and church decorations, Miss Bigelow was associated for many years with Lionel Robertson, with the Tobey furniture company. At present she is devoting all her time to her own studio work. Recently much time has been spent in paint-

ing and decorating old furniture, bringing it back to a surprising loveliness.

Miss Robertson, the "quilt lady," will display her famous appliqued quilts. Fine old colonial quilts have been the inspiration for a distinctly modern interpretation of this true American art expression. Marguerite Williams of the Chicago Daily News is quoted in the following statement: "There are now, it is said, fifteen groups of women in Chicago neighborhoods who are making quilts, but probably none has injected new life into the old art as has Miss Robertson."

As supervisor of art in over 30 schools in Chicago, she is a very busy person and yet she has somehow found the time to design and execute a collection of quilts which have been shown throughout the country and also in England and Scotland. Their value has been proven by the award of the Mrs. Julius Rosenwald first prize in textiles at the Art Institute.

The hours of the exhibition will be from two to six o'clock on Saturday afternoon. Tea will be ser-

ved at the homes of Miss Bigelow, Miss Robertson and Miss Heinroth, where other paintings and handicraft may be seen. It is open to the public and a very cordial invitation is extended to all who are interested.

Election Officials Will Be at Polls Also on Nov. 1; List Polling Places

The first registration day for Lake county voters who expect to cast their ballots in the general election on November 8 is October 18, and those who fail to visit the polling places on that date will have another opportunity on November 1, the last day for registering in this county.

Election officials will be at each polling place in the several townships on October 18 to give information to voters and see that they are properly registered. They will be at the polling places again on November 1.

Those voters who cast their ballots at the April primary undoubtedly are listed in the poll books with their addresses as of that date. Anyone who has removed to another precinct since should be sure to see that his or her name is listed in the poll list of the precinct in which their new address is. Also, it is pointed out by election officials, it is a safe precaution for everybody to make sure that his or her name is on the list in the precinct in which he or she lives.

Those who did not vote in the April primary should not fail to visit the polling places in their respective precincts on October 18 to make sure that they are registered. If you are not registered it may be necessary to swear in your vote on election day, it is explained.
